

Forgiveness:

The Key to Peace of Soul and Peace in the World

"Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?"

--Matthew 18: 33



People saddled with impossible debt, desperate pleas for more time, threats of imprisonment and even torture—why did Jesus tell such an upsetting parable? To help His disciples understand the need to show mercy when someone sins against them.

Peter's question started it all: "How often must I forgive?" Mt. 18: 21. It was understandable. Shouldn't there be a limit to how often we should forgive, especially repeated offenses? An honest look at ourselves might help us see the answer. How often do we go to the Lord asking mercy for the same sins over and over again? We would never want Him to tell us that we have reached our limit. Thankfully, He never does; He repeatedly forgives us.

Not only does God forgive us again and again; He doesn't hold our sins against us. Remember the unforgiving servant. His entire debt was wiped out. There was nothing hanging over him. Similarly, God has pardoned every sin we have ever committed and stands ready to forgive every sin we will ever commit. Nothing is outside the scope of His mercy. He forgives us everything. (But let's not try His patience.)

This is the standard of mercy that Jesus calls us to imitate. It's not so different from the Lord's Prayer: "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." Mt. 6: 12. Granted, today's parable is more graphic. But it shows us that God doesn't want us imprisoned in unforgiveness and tortured by resentment. He knows how hard it is to forgive. But He went so far as to give us His only Son to cleanse us and soften our hearts so that we could share that same mercy.

Mercy goes beyond simply not punishing offenses. It forgives the entire debt. That's how God treats us. It's the essence of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Let that truth change how you treat the people who offend you.

Heavenly Father, strengthen me to be able to forgive others as you have forgiven me.

R.C.I.A. and Adult Confirmation

The Catholic Church continually welcomes new members. The **R**ite of **C**hristian **I**nitiation of **A**dults (R.C.I.A.) is the Church's process of welcoming those new adult members to grow in their faith and enter into full communion.

The R.C.I.A. is the experience through which the Catholic community:

- Baptizes new adult members
- Receives those adults from another faith tradition who want to be members of the Catholic Church.

We also encourage any adult who has been Baptized Catholic and received their First Eucharist and wishes to be a fully initiated Catholic to join us in preparation to receive the **Sacrament of Confirmation**. Preparation consists of an initial interview and sessions on topics of Catholicism. We generally meet for these sessions at the convenience of those involved. Both R.C.I.A. and Adult Confirmation are adult faith sharing processes which begin in September with interviewing, with sessions usually beginning in October.

Pilgrimage to Medjugorje. I mention that I will be going on a pilgrimage to this site in Bosnia-Herzegovina where the Blessed Mother has appeared to six 'visionaries' since the early 1980's. The appearances still take place, though not as frequently as in the past. The Blessed Mother often speaks of her desire for the world to turn back to her Son. The appearances are regarded as authentic by the Vatican.

Joining together in this pilgrimage will be parishioners of Queen of Peace, St. Thomas, and beyond. The dates are **Oct. 9 thru Oct. 17.** Vocationalist Fathers from the Sanctuary of Mary will be covering the Masses on the week-end.

It is a custom for prayer intentions to be brought to the site of the Blessed Mother's appearances. I offer to take your petitions to Medjugorje. Simply write them on 3" x 5" index cards or paper, and bring them, in an envelope, to either church. Drop them in the collection basket or bring them to the Parish Office. They will be placed before the Blessed Mother during my time there.

Please pray that this will be a fruitful experience for all the pilgrims, and for me.


