



November, Month of All Souls

There is nothing that equalizes us as much as death. We each get one, and none of us knows the day or the hour. The circumstances of our birth determine much about our lives and our future possibilities. We, who are born in this country, for example, are so fortunate compared to people born in poverty-stricken places throughout the world. Yet for each person born, no matter where or under what life-conditions, there is that moment when the things of this world come to an end.

Death for us humans is naturally experienced as sorrow and grief. When someone we love is taken from us in death, we know that deep, often wrenching changes must be faced. That person, who has been so intimate a part of our lives, is there no more to be a companion and support. All that was shared together can no longer be. We experience a profound sense of loss.

We sometimes contemplate our own future death. Perhaps it is in those moments that we most treasure the life that we do have. Yet we know, and fear, that some unknown day ahead will be our last. Again, a sense of sadness and even depression can come to us.

Perhaps right here is the beauty and the treasure of our faith. Our Lord Jesus has been through death and has shown us what lies on the other side: the fullness of life, a peace and happiness and joy to which there is no comparison on this earth. Jesus' three days in the tomb surely brought His disciples, and probably even His Mother, to the brink of despair. And then, on Easter Sunday, His glorious Resurrection and His appearances to them brought an unbounded, incomparable joy. The Lord wishes all believers to share in this kind of joy—a joy that "destroys death forever" as Isaiah prophesied six centuries before.

Our Lord's Resurrection, and our faith in Him, has changed the way we look at death. Yes, it still is the end of our life on this earth, but it is not a blank wall; it is not an end. Death, Jesus reveals, is a doorway, and it leads us to the greatest happiness imaginable. Perhaps the greatest happiness we will find is to discover our dear departed loved ones waiting for us, to share the Eternal Banquet of Heaven with them.

And so, although we naturally would put off the moment of death, we need not dread it, because it becomes the promise of greater and more wonderful things ahead. "Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, what God has ready for those who love Him," as one of our hymns puts it.

Let us thank the Lord for the precious gift of faith, the gift that helps us look past the moment of death and to look forward to a union with Him and with our loved ones—which will last forever.

organization of the lay apostolate in which Catholic men, women and youth sanctify themselves through prayer and apostolic work in union with Our Lady under the guidance of a priest.





Celebrate November

"All you holy men, women and children pray for us!" We believe in the Communion of Saints. This month, we celebrate All Saints and All Souls, honoring all who are part of the family of God. Please pray this Prayer for All Souls each day:

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly Most Holy Name Catholic Church, Garfield, NJ

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time November 5, 2023

"With such affection for you, we were determined to share with you, not only the gospel of God, but our very selves as well, so dearly beloved had you become to us...And for this reason we too give thanks to God unceasingly, that, in receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word but, as it truly is, the word of God, which is now at work in you who believe."

Saint Paul had no difficulty identifying his deep concern for the communities he served. His mission to preach the gospel is so evident in the fourteen letters of the New Testament. But he also commends those who accepted the word, acknowledging it as the Word of God. Whenever we come to mass, or when we open the bible, may we begin acknowledging that the Lord has a message for us. May we humbly open our ears and our heart as we say, 'See Lord, your servant is listening.'

When the priest or deacon begins his homily, may we pray that the Lord speak clearly through him and let the Word of God continue to be at work in us.
