# Rejoice Always! Always? Always!!

When Saint Paul tells us to "rejoice always" (1 Thessalonians 5: 16) it might seem that he is asking the impossible. How can we *always* feel joyful? Isn't this too much to ask, even today on Gaudete (or "Rejoice") Sunday?



Not according to St. Thomas Aquinas! He taught that "joy is caused by love" (Summa Theologiae II-II, q. 28). As we experience God's love for us, we grow in love for Him—and this exchange of love is what produces joy in us. St. Paul also knew that God's love was the secret to joy, which is why he follows up his exhortation to "rejoice always" with specific steps that we can take to experience His love more deeply.

First, pray without ceasing (1 Thes. 5" 17). When we open our hearts to God throughout the day, He fills us with His very self. The experience of His unconditional love and unending mercy ignites our love in return.

Second, in all circumstances give thanks (1 Thes. 5: 18). Gratitude also deepens our love for God, especially when we reflect on who He is and what He has done for us. And in this Advent Season, whatever our circumstances, we can thank God for sending His Son to earth to become one of us.

Finally, do not quench the Spirit (1 Thes. 5: 19). In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul tells us that "the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit." (1 Thes. 5: 5). If we want more joy in our lives, we should ask the Spirit to stir up the love of God in our hearts. And when He does, we can express it by praising Him—which will, in turn, increase our joy.

Joy is not just for Gaudete Sunday; it is for every day. So each day, follow Paul's advice: turn to the Lord in prayer, thank Him for all that He has done for you, and ask Him to fill you with more of His Spirit. Then praise Him—and let your spirit soar!

Lord, shower me with Your love today so that my heart swells with joy!

# Advent Traditions ~ The Las Posadas

Las Posadas is a celebration that has its origins in Spain and is now practiced in Latin America. It usually consists of a procession of people with Mary and Joseph (played by a couple, sometimes even riding a real donkey) as they travel from house to house or church to church. As they go, the whole group sings a traditional song asking for lodging; at each place, they are refused until, at the last place, they are finally welcomed. Everyone enters, prays the Rosary before a nativity scene, then celebrates with a party.



The beautiful statue of Our Lady of Fatima in the Sanctuary of St. Thomas is waiting to visit your home!

The purpose of the statue is a way the message of Fatima is spread throughout the world. It brings the graces of Fatima along with Our Lady's message of hope, peace and salvation. Each week, a family or a parishioner will receive this image at the end of Mass. You will be provided with a safe way for it to travel to and from your home. You may keep her in your home for the week and then return her back to church the following week before the start of Mass. Included in the box will be rosaries, prayer cards, books and holy water to help you in your prayer time. These things must be returned when you bring the statue back.

We encourage all of our Religious Education families and all parishioners to take part in this beautiful and holy experience!
