

In the Dead of Winter:

Life is Stirring Underneath

A number of people have told me that they have had enough of Winter. They're ready for warmer weather:

bring on the grass and green leaves. I reminded them that we still have two-thirds of Winter to go yet. Sometimes the truth hurts. Yet we know that while Winter prevails now, Spring advances ever closer. With the sundown of each day, the next day holds a promise of approaching growth and warmth.

Our spiritual lives should follow the same pattern. But it is not automatic. We can remain 'stuck in neutral' as it were. Or we can move forward, even slowly, and grow in our spiritual lives. How can you tell if you're making any progress with growing in the spirit? Here are some questions to consider this week:

- ❖ Are you performing specific actions or not—regularly attending Mass; regular, daily prayer or adoration; regular Bible study or reading; devotions like the rosary or novenas—on-going, continuing ways of attending to the spirit.
- Also, is there a consciousness of doing things during the week for the sake of Christ: encouraging others in their faith; expressing <u>your</u> faith in public (saying grace in a restaurant, for example); any consciousness that your actions and words and example are important because <u>you</u> are a disciple of the Lord today?
- On personal habits: Are you consciously working to improve: overcoming cursing, for example, or white lies or gossip; defeating that tendency to put yourself first or always getting in the last word; working to change those habits that annoy your spouse or other family members. If you are consciously working on any improvement—you are growing in the spirit.
- ❖ Likewise, becoming more appreciative of nature—maybe not the freezing cold-=but appreciative of the beauty and power of nature as God's creation, and allowing it to speak to you of God's majesty and wisdom.
- ❖ Do you follow those impulses to put ourselves out for the sake of others, knowing our natural tendency is just the opposite—to seek our own comfort first. Do you work to follow the Holy Spirit's lead in stepping out of your comfort zone and guiding your spirit to greater heights.

Growing, making progress in our spiritual life is as necessary as growing and maintaining our bodies. May we continually renew ourselves in spirit—and follow the way that the Holy Spirit points out to us.


Our Lady of Fatima Pilgrim Statue

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly Most Holy Name Catholic Church, Garfield, NJ

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 21, 2024

"Jonah had gone but a single day's walk announcing, 'Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed.' When the people of Nineveh believed God they proclaimed a fast... When God saw their actions how they turned from their evil way, he repented of the evil he had threatened... Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God, 'This is the time of fulfillment, the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel."

Two preachers, the same message. The people of Nineveh repented. Jesus called the Galileans to repentance. The message is the same for us today. Are we listening? Our world burdened by hate, war, promiscuity, family breakdown, is perhaps worse than was Nineveh and Galilee. If we all would respond by our own prayer and fasting things could be quite different. Our problem as we read the scriptures today is our own indifference.
