

"Let us not hear again the voice of the Lord."

-- Deuteronomy 18: 16

Addressing the Israelites as they are about to enter the Promised Land, Moses recalls what happened when God was about to give them the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai. God announced His presence with lightening, thunder, a deafening shofar blast, and menacing dark smoke. (Exodus 20: 18—19) Terrified, the people backed away, saying "Let us not again hear the voice of the Lord!" (Deuteronomy 18: 16) They begged Moses to go himself to bring God's Word back to them!

Knowing that he was not going to be with them much longer, Moses promises that God will send them someone to take his place, "a prophet like me … to whom you shall listen." (Deut. 18: 15) What a relief! God promises that they will never again have to endure the trauma of hearing Him directly.

And so it was. In every generation, God raised up prophets for the people. Deborah, Elijah, Isaiah, Jeremiah; these and others heard God directly and proclaimed what they had heard.

But now, through Jesus, the living "Word" of God, everything has changed. By destroying sin and death, He has opened the pathway for us sinners to come before the all-holy God. Now, every single person can know God personally. Every single person can hear His voice—in Scripture, through the Church, and most importantly, in the depths of their hearts.

You don't ever have to be afraid of coming into God's presence! In fact, He is already present in you! Through His Spirit, He is urging you to call out to Him, "Abba, Father!" (Romans 8: 15). He is waiting to receive you with open arms, to wash you clean in His mercy, and to fill your heart with His joy and consolation.

Your heavenly Father has a message that He wants to speak to you today—a message meant only for you. So quiet your heart, calm your fears, and listen.

Here I am Lord. I long to hear Your voice today.

Sacred Scripture

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time January 28, 2024

"A prophet like me will the Lord God raise up for you, from among your own kin, to him you shall listen... I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into their mouth, he shall tell them all that I command him. Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it."

The first pages of scripture tell us of a promised redeemer. The prophets, the spokespersons for God constantly reminded the people of their covenant with God. John the Baptist pointed out Jesus as the one. Jesus being present made a new covenant, and today that covenant is renewed in His church.

Promise, prophets, presence, preaching, the story of salvation for us all. READY FOR LENT ?? Here is an early notice that **Lent is soon on the way**. This sacred season begins on **February 14 Ash Wednesday** and continues through Holy Week, till Thurs. March 28. The "Triduum" begins that evening, with Holy Thursday, then Good Friday and Holy Saturday. The Easter Vigil Mass (Sat. March 30), celebrates our Lord's Resurrection and the promise of our own. This continues to **Easter Sunday, March 31**, followed by seven weeks of the Easter Season.

Plan now to join with the entire Church throughout the world in this time of Lenten Retreat just ahead of us. Let it be a chance to become secure in the confidence of God's love.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is held every Friday, from 10 a.m. till 12 Noon at St. Thomas Church. It is a chance to come before the Lord in reflection and silence. It allows you to experience inner peace, and enables God to speak to you from His very Presence on the altar. You can stay for 15 minutes or for two hours. A visit with the Lord can bring new hope and deeper trust into your life of faith. Give it a try. The Lord is waiting.

Bible Study is a chance to delve more deeply into individual books of the Bible, and to learn their background and to ponder more deeply the meaning of the passages. We meet every Tuesday at 1 p.m. and continue till about 2:15 each time in the Fr. Lewis Center at St. Thomas. Refreshments are served as we work to digest the deeper meaning of God's Word.
