


The Basic Rules and Guidance for Christianity, Judaism and Islam

The Ten Commandments



The Ten Commandments (also called the Decalogue) were given to Moses, the great leader of the Hebrews, over **3,000 years ago** after the Hebrews were delivered from slavery in Egypt. While the Law of Moses (the Laws promoted by the Pharisees) is made up of over 600 rules, the Ten Commandments were a succinct list of rules from which the others were developed.

- 1. I am the Lord your God; you shall have no other gods before Me.
- 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain.
- 3. You shall keep holy the Lord's Day.
- 4. Honor your father and mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

The Seven Precepts of the Church

The Precepts of the Church have been developing since the 4^{th} century. They are meant to keep the faithful in the full and complete spirit of the Catholic Church. The latest Precept is # 7, added in the last century.

- 1. To assist at Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
- 2. To fast and abstain on days appointed.
- 3. To go to Confession at least once a year.
- 4. To receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter Season.
- 5. To contribute to the support of the Church.
- 6. To observe the laws of the Church concerning marriage.
- 7. To take part in the Missionary work of the Church


The Legion of Mary meets every Tuesday morning at 9:45 at St. Thomas the Apostle church after the 9 AM Daily Mass. We gather in the meeting

On Monday evenings from 7:00pm until 8:30pm, our church (and every church in the Diocese of Paterson) will be open for Confession. I am asking all parents and children (who have already received the Sacrament of Reconciliation) to please make this beautiful experience part of your Lenten journey! As Father Wayne is not available for this on Sunday class time, students in grades 5 through 8 are asked to attend on one of the Lenten Monday nights (check bulletin for which church). Students in grades 3 and 4 will go during their class time on March 5th, when Father Wayne will be with us. Let's make this the BEST Lent and Easter ever as we celebrate God's love, mercy, forgiveness and healing!

Catholics around the world spend 40 days before Easter focused on prayer, fasting, almsgiving (charity) and the reception of the sascraments. All of these things help us realize our need for Jesus. As we already approach the halfway point of Lent, how is your Lenten journey going so far???

Sacred Scripture

Preparation means getting ready. God prepares great things for us, and we also prepare for him, especially during special seasons of our faith, such as Advent and Lent. Here are some words from Sacred Scripture about preparation:

"If anyone cleanses himself of these things, he will be a vessel for lofty use, dedicated beneficial to the master of the house, ready for every good work." (2 Timothy 2:21)

When we make our hearts clean by asking forgiveness for wrong choices, God can use us to do good things. What are some things you need to ask God to forgive? Pray an "I'm sorry" prayer to God today!

The Sacramental Sign-In Book for our children and teens who are preparing for the Sacraments of First Eucharist (grades 1 & 2) and Confirmation (grades 7 & 8) These Binders (Red – Conf. Class/White – FE Class) will be kept in the back of BOTH churches and must be signed each week. Joyful participation in the weekly Celebration of the Eucharist as well as on Holydays of Obligation is a requirement for the reception of these sacraments. It is also expected of all faithful Catholics!!!

You may keep her in your home for the week and then return her back to church the following week before the start of Mass. Confessions during Lent will again be available in every Catholic Church of the Paterson Diocese, each Monday of Lent, from 7 p.m. till 8:30 p.m. Reconciliation is at the heart of the Lenten Season. Plan now to prepare well for Easter. At our parishes, the schedule will be:

Stations of the Cross at St. James will be prayed every Friday afternoon in Lent at 3 p.m. Make the Stations a part of your Lenten offerings to the Lord.

A Mass with the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at St. James Church on Saturday, March 16th. Guest homilist will be Fr. Raymond Pavlick, former Veterans Affairs chaplain for Baltimore and Castle Point, and serving in the Archdiocese for Military Services.

The Sacrament is available to anyone, simply due to older age, or with chronic conditions, or approaching surgery. The Mass will begins at `11:00 a. m. 
