




- Prepare for Mass with full Mass readings for each Sunday and Holy Day Mass of obligation.


## **Ushers Needed**

rom the Pastor's Desk...

Understanding the Mass Continued...

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is a propitiatory sacrifice and is the means by which the reality of the Sacrifice of the Cross is made accessible in this current time. The question remains as to how this grace, these effects of the Sacrifice of the Cross, are made available. One way is certainly through assisting at Mass. In assisting at Mass one is praying attentively and is actually participating in the sacrifice at the altar by uniting oneself to that same sacrifice and thus perfecting the offering of oneself to God through that perfect offering, the perfect act of obedience, Our Lord's surrendering His life to the Father for our sake on the Cross.

In addition to uniting oneself to the Sacrifice of the Cross by assisting at Mass, Our Lord has given us the Sacraments us to have access to the graces he won for us as the true Victor at the Cross. Indeed, we initially participate in the graces of the Cross through baptism, receiving that first grace, sanctifying grace, by which we are freed from our original sin, made adopted children of the Father, and are made co-heirs to the Kingdom of Heaven. Indeed, when we are baptized, we are baptized into the death of Christ so that we might also rise with Him. Here we see the effects of the Cross made available through the Sacrament of Baptism. This means that those effects are intimately bound up with the Sacrifice of the Mass as it is that same sacrifice offered in un-bloody manner. Indeed all of the Sacraments and the graces they effect relate back to the Mass in this same way.

Here, we can now answer why we need to go to Confession despite the already propitiatory meaning of the Mass. While venial sins may be forgiven in a number of ways, an act of contrition, alms-giving, the reception of Holy Communion, et cetera, there is only one way to forgive Mortal sin after baptism, the Sacrament of Confession. Deriving the capacity to bestow grace and forgive sin from the Cross and relatedly the Mass, Our Lord has instituted this Sacrament to restore our relationship with Him once we have severed it by totally rejecting His love with our sin. As the blood of animals was used to pay for sin under the Old Law, so is Our Lord's Blood to pay for our sins in the New Law, but Old or New, one has always needed to confess one's sins to the Lord's minister, the priest. "I said, 'I confess my transgression to the LORD,' and you took away the guilt of my sin." (Ps 32:5)
