

From the Pastor's Desk...

Anger Tips

All of us have vices to which we are more inclined than others. For many, the capital vice of anger presents a unique challenge. It can cause inner distress and turmoil and when acted upon, can be a seriously destructive force in our lives. In addition to offending God, the vice of anger can destroy our relationships and deteriorate the inner peace God wants for us.

Tanquerey, in his exemplary work *The Spiritual Life: A Treatise on Ascetical and Mystical Theology*, distinguishes between the passion of anger and the sentiment of anger. The passion arises from the moment as a reaction to a provocation either physical or moral. It is an intense emotion which is often difficult to overcome.

Anger as sentiment is described by Tanquerey as "a sentiment consists in a vehement desire to repel and punish an aggressor." Aggressor may be seen here as anyone who gives offence, moral or otherwise. Tanquerey notes that this is not necessarily sinful so long as the sentiment is justly directed only at the deserving, tempered in execution, and motivated by charity.

Anger both as a passion and as a sentiment can become sinful. When anger is not proportional, not just, or not in keeping with charity, it becomes sinful and can even be mortally sinful.

If you are unclear if you have a problem with the vice of anger, get a journal and write in the journal a notation each time you become angry for seven days. Write the time, how angry you felt at the time on a scale of one to ten, what caused the anger, and at whom it was directed. Wait another seven days and look back at the journal. How often were you angry, and how intensely? Was this a reasonable response to the situation? Was it directed at the correct source? Speak with your spouse, close friend or family member about what you find, you don't necessarily have to show them the journal. Ask their opinion.

Some remedies for the passion of anger include, being aware of situations, times, and people who have the potential to set us off. Also, when the anger arises we must fight back immediately. Pray and ask for God's assistance. Divert your mind and intentionally think of anything but the cause of your anger. Finally, if this is a common problem, every morning we should pray for Our Lady's intercession to give us the virtue of meekness.

For the sentiment of anger, remedies include the increase of charity, primarily the love of God. We are all from the same heavenly Father and He desires the salvation of us all. Say the Our Father slowly, thinking about the meaning of and giving emphasis to, "Forgive us our trespasses *as we forgive* those who trespass against us." Remember and meditate on the Cross and how Our Lord forgave His executioners the most unjust and outrageous crime in the history of the world. Do not allow yourself to dwell on injuries and wrongs, these only serve to reignite our anger. Finally, pray for those who injure us. Pray for conversion of heart and desire their greatest good with all your strength.

Overcoming the vice of anger can be a long, difficult, and sometimes frustrating journey, but with perseverance and God's grace, you can be liberated from this deadly vice.

- The radical amendment would likely abolish existing health and safety protections for women, like those requiring that pregnant women seeking an abortion be screened and counseled by a licensed doctor who could transfer her to a hospital if something went wrong.

Allow painful, late-term abortions, even after 15 weeks and right up until the moment of birth.

- The amendment would greenlight abortion all the way up to birth by giving abortionists the final say on what's allowed.
- Constitutional scholars Carrie Campbell Severino and Frank J. Scaturro recently wrote in their legal analysis that the amendment language would "effectively obliterate most limits to abortion or sex-change surgery."
