## **Come And Join The Fun On Family Faith Sunday May 3rd!**

All families are welcome to our Family Faith Sunday program to learn more about our faith through fun activities and shared discussions. As we continue to journey in the Easter Season, we will be discussing how God always hears us when we pray with our Bible Lesson: *“I am the vine, and my Father is the vine grower”* from the Gospel of John 15:1-5. Together we will explore in our bible lesson: Who is the vine and who are the branches? What happens when the branches are not connected to the vine? And, what kinds of things do we need in order to stay connected to Jesus, the “True Vine”?

Also, in preparation for Pentecost Sunday on May 24th, we will continue our bible lesson with the Gospel of John 16:12-14 when Jesus said to His disciples. *“I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. 

## **WHEEL Vigils For Homeless Deaths**

Did you know that WHEEL (parent organization of our women's shelter) gathers with Mary's Place (an empowerment ministry for women and children) to hold "Women in Black" silent vigils every time a homeless individual dies on the streets of Seattle? The vigils began in May, 2000 and are held to honor the lives of those who have died as well as to draw visibility to the issue. When they learn of a death, they gather the following Wednesday at noon at the Seattle Justice Center (5th and Cherry), where they stand in silent vigil for an hour. Supporters also leaflet passersby with information about the vigil and how the community, working together, can solve homelessness. Sadly, this year Women in Black is bearing witness to the highest rate of homeless deaths that they've seen in their 15-year history. **Gates Foundation Teen Action Fair Interactive Presentation - Juan Diego Projects In Action** - Last weekend, four OLG 8th graders accompanied me (J.C. Santos, 8th grade teacher) to the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Visitor's Center to represent the Juan Diego Project at their annual Teen Action Fair. We were one of about twenty local groups that were on hand to share with the general public about how we engage teenagers in service and social justice. Anna spoke about her work to help build a local children's hospice care facility - something very rare in our country - and Dominic F. discussed his outreach with Westside Baby. Eleanor highlighted her experience at Food Lifeline, and Isabel shared her stories of removing invasive plants with Earth Corps. We were in the midst of some very powerful projects, from groups that worked to end human trafficking here in Seattle and beyond, to groups that promoted racial equality, to groups that supported education in impoverished communities in India, and so many other groups. The one common thread we all shared was a belief that youth have the ability to make the world a better place *now*. I felt inspired to see so many young people, just like all of our students at OLG, building their foundation of service at such an early age. It was such an honor for us to be a part of a day that celebrated youth activism and to have a platform such as the Gates Foundation to amplify our messages. Thank you to the students, their parents, and especially Mrs. Wilson for also speaking about the school and the Juan Diego Project.
