From the Pastor's Desk

Integrity Is A Challenge For Hillary Clinton, Donald Trump And Ourselves

Today's Gospel focuses on integrity and the important place it should play in our lives. While our two major presidential candidates flail each other on the issue of integrity, it is a good week to ask ourselves about our own integrity.

Integrity is like losing weight: simple but not easy. Make a list of things in your life that fit together with your commitment to bear the title of Christian. List the things that do not fit and pray for the wisdom and courage to bring your life in line. Integrity is an important issue for Donald, Hillary and ourselves.

Three Celebrations Of Life And Death This Week

This week, I was involved in the deaths of three people whose lives were both similar and very different. All three brought together family and friends to celebrate love, faith, hope and the goodness found in all three lives.

Matthew Benoit was 28 when a virulent form of cancer took his life. Matthew had been a star swimmer for the California Bears Swim Team and a successful young business person in the Bay area. Matthew was only three when I started St. John The Baptist Parish in Covington.

John Plummer, while not a parishioner of OLG, was the beloved brother of Tom Plummer of our parish. John was injured as a young man in a car accident and suffered serious physical and emotional difficulties throughout his life. John's life was made richer by the love and care of Tom and Sandy Plummer of our parish.

Rhett Richards, an OLG graduate, died while commercial fishing in Alaska. Rhett, like Matthew, was filled with love for life. Rhett had a deep appreciation for creation. We used Psalm 148 to bring a focus to Rhett's life. Paula, his mother, has been a faith filled member of OLG for many years.

While each of these men experienced life very differently, they had a common experience of death. Matthew's prayer card had this reflection by Charles Peguy, a French writer and philosopher. I offer Peguy's thought on death for all of us who, like Matthew, John and Rhett, knew death would visit some day.



Multi-Communities Violence Prevention Project Donations Needed

Local non-profit Multi-Communities is running an 11-week violence awareness, prevention and intervention group for East African and Black/African men, ages 18-24, called the "Men's Circle Journey Project". Join OLG parishioners and staff for the CROP Hunger Walk on October 2nd as we walk with other congregations to end hunger around the world. The walk starts at 1:00 p.m. at Alki UCC. It is approximately 5K, close to the average distance a woman has to walk to get water in many places in Africa and Asia. Prayers And Squares Quilt Ministry Continues To Serve Our Community With Love

The beautiful quilts that you see in the back of our church are quilts made by our Prayers and Squares ministry team which meets on the first Tuesday of each month from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Parish Pastoral Center. If you want to join our ministry, please call the parish office at 206-935-0358. It does not matter if you have been a quilter for years or have no experience and just want to learn, please come and fellowship with some wonderful ladies who serve our community so faithfully.

Quilts become prayer quilts as a result of the prayers that are tied into them. When a request for a prayer quilt is made from a family, we ask for any special prayer intentions that we can make available for our community to pray for when tying the prayer knots. When the prayer quilt is presented, they can feel each prayer by all of the prayer knots that are tied just for them. Here is what you do:

- Pick up untied thread and make a square knot (right over left, then left over right). Pull the knot firmly against the surface of the quilt.
- Offer a prayer for the person who will receive the quilt. Please remember that person in your regular prayers throughout the week.
