# Thank You For Riding The Wave

As most of you know, our community is striving to become debt free by Christmas 2017. Thank you to parishioners who are making pledges and gifts from assets to help the community. Thank you as well to parishioners and children who are placing gifts of cash in the envelopes marked, "Unlocking the Door to the Future". This past week, a grade school aged parishioner made a personal contribution of \$100 to debt elimination. We also received gifts of \$15,000 to \$5. The tide is coming in. Thank you.

One of the ways to support a parish or school is through bequests. During the fiscal year 2015-2016, parishes reported receiving \$2,444,643. 27 parishes received 57 bequests - some received more than one. The average bequest was \$42,888, the highest single bequest was \$428,000.

In our efforts to protect our vulnerable population, on March 19, 2017, all of our Faith Formation classes, with the exception of our Little Lambs and Lord Lions classes, will offer one sexual abuse prevention course to your youth. The Archdioceses of Seattle has integrated abuse prevention material into our Faith Formation and Youth Ministry curriculum in the context of teaching our youth about our Catholic faith.

In creating a safe space for our youth, we can teach and show them the ways of Christ in a safe environment conducive to learning. Keeping our minor's safe starts with you. We ask that you take part in this effort in extending the Archbishop's effort to help evangelize our youth in a safe place.

This announcement is to notify you of the Archdioceses new initiative to provide abuse prevention curriculum to our youth in Faith Formation/Your Ministry. For your added convenience, a letter will be given to all of our families along with a copy of the Archdiocese Q&A about the abuse prevention program as well as a copy of the curriculum and the form if your chose to opt-out of this training on March 19th. Prayers and Squares officially became a Chapter Member #1158 on October, 20, 2014. As a ministry, over 60 quilts have been made and presented, each a special gift of love and hope.

The beautiful quilts that you see in the back of our church are quilts made by our Prayers and Squares ministry team which meets on the first Tuesday of each month from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Parish Pastoral Center. If you want to join our ministry, please call the parish office at 206-935-0358. It does not matter if you have been a quilter for years or have no experience and just want to learn, please come and fellowship with some wonderful ladies who serve our community so faithfully.

Quilts become prayer quilts as a result of the prayers that are tied into them. When a request for a prayer quilt is made from a family, we ask for any special prayer intentions that we can make available for our community to pray for when tying the prayer knots. When the prayer quilt is presented, they can feel each prayer by all of the prayer knots that are tied just for them. Here is what you do:

- Pick up untied thread and make a square knot (right over left, then left over right). Pull the not firmly against the surface of the quilt.
- Offer a prayer for the person who will receive the quilt.
   Please remember that person in your regular prayers throughout the week.
