Spring Training For Christians/Lent

One way to think about the Lenten season is to equate it to spring training for all the major League Baseball teams. Right now, the Mariners and all the teams are down in sunny climates working on fundamentals. Pitching, catching, running, throwing, fitness - all these are worked on for weeks. Let's hope our Mariners are training well.

One way to see Lent is a Spring Training for Christians. We are encouraged for six weeks to focus on the basics of Christian living. We began last Wednesday with our celebration of Ash Wednesday. Too many of us stop right there and don't pursue the rest of Lent with the intention of becoming more like Christ. Like baseball spring training, there are helpful disciplines to follow to deepen the roots of our faith.

Preparing for our reconciliation services and confessions through a daily examination of our lives by asking how was I like Christ today?

Taking time for daily prayer through reading of the Scriptures.

Faithfulness to Sunday Masses with the foundational scriptures leading us to understand the meaning of the resurrection.

Fasting not just from food and drink but fasting from gossip, negativity, judgement, and superfluous shopping might be examples.

Our parish library provides an excellent source of spiritual reading.

Service opportunities abound in our parish.

Stations of the cross are available as well as your rosaries.

Lent is like spring training - to be excellent Christians, we need to return to basics once in a while. Lent is that time.

I am looking forward to celebrating these Lenten days with you.

From the beginnings of the Church, the followers of Jesus spread out to surrounding nations and told others about Him. Many people from other lands became Christians in this way and, sometimes, they would travel to Jerusalem to see the places where Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection took place. As they would walk the path that Jesus took to Golgotha, they felt a special connection with Him. Following in these footsteps of the Lord, along this Way of the Cross, became a popular pilgrimage. CCC 1674, 2669, 2691.

The Stations of the Cross, as we know them today, developed for people who could not make the journey to Jerusalem to visit these holy places. We invite families to come and walk in the footsteps of Jesus and experience the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord during Lent. Families will take home symbols for each station and a Stations of the Cross and a prayer booklet with prayers to continue this wonderful form of prayer during Lent. We hope you can come to this special Family Faith Sunday and encourage you to bring someone with you who would also like to participate in praying the Stations of the Cross as a community.

Lent At Home

Activities for Busy Catholic Families

Given the many challenges facing today's families, now is the perfect time and home is the perfect place to experience Lent. After all, home is where we rush and rest, where we hope and worry, where we love and forgive. It is home where we most often experience day-to-day salvation. Lenten experiences can take place in nearly every room of the house. Here are some ideas to try to enrich your celebration of Lent at home.

Family Effort - Engage young people in a discussion about how they can support their family members' Lenten commitments. Begin by providing a suggestion, such as offering to cook a meat-free meal on one of the Fridays of Lent. Write a list of their suggestions. Encourage them to select a few of the items they have listed and to include the actions as part of their own Lenten commitments.

Lenten Family Mealtime - In addition to "Friday fish day," designate one evening a week to prepare a meal together. Assign a different dish or task to each family member. Before starting, discuss how each family member is giving to the others - giving time, effort, and care to nourish the entire family to go out and do God's will. Begin with a prayer of thanks and petition.

Family Lenten Reading - Prominently display the Bible and other books that feature topics such as the following: Lent, forgiveness, prayer, Scripture, generosity, social justice and service for others. You might wish to display *Praying Lent: Renewing Our Lives on the Lenten Journey*, a small booklet by Andy Alexander, SJ or *A Prayer Book of Catholic Devotions* by William G. Storey, which offers s special section dedicated to Lenten reflection in addition to prayers for other seasons and normal time. Invite family members to choose books and discuss what you read.

Prayers And Squares Quilt Ministry Continues To Serve Our Community With Love

Prayers and Squares officially became a Chapter Member #1158 on October, 20, 2014. As a ministry, over 60 quilts have been made and presented, each a special gift of love and hope.

The beautiful quilts that you see in the back of our church are quilts made by our Prayers and Squares ministry team which meets on the first Tuesday of each month from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Parish Pastoral Center. If you want to join our ministry, please call the parish office at 206-935-0358. It does not matter if you have been a quilter for years or have no experience and just want to learn, please come and fellowship with some wonderful ladies who serve our community so faithfully.

Quilts become prayer quilts as a result of the prayers that are tied into them. When a request for a prayer quilt is made from a family, we ask for any special prayer intentions that we can make available for our community to pray for when tying the prayer knots. When the prayer quilt is presented, they can feel each prayer by all of the prayer knots that are tied just for them. Here is what you do:

- Pick up untied thread and make a square knot (right over left, then left over right). Pull the not firmly against the surface of the quilt.
- Offer a prayer for the person who will receive the quilt.
 Please remember that person in your regular prayers throughout the week.
