# From the Pastor's Desk

#### **Encounter With Forgiveness And Reconciliation**

The coming weeks of Holy Week and Easter will provide, in the Scriptures, many examples of biblical characters encountering Jesus and being changed. During Lent, we have witnessed Jesus and the Woman at the Well and the Man Born Blind. These stories were compelling encounters for these two people. I suspect that all of us could find ourselves in the man born blind. How many times have we all seen someone or some situation clearly and later found out that there was more to the person or situation than we first thought.

This week, we have the opportunity to let God show us ourselves more clearly through encountering God's mercy through our two communal Reconciliation Services on Wednesday and Saturday. For those who are new to the parish or who have never participated in a Communal Penance Service, they are prayerful, biblically based encounters of God's mercy through prayer, music, reflection and absolution of our sins. For me, these experiences help me to face the sins of self-deception that we can all fall into. These services take about an hour.

Wednesday Night at 7:00 p.m. Saturday Afternoon at 1:00 p.m.

An encounter with God's mercy and the challenge to be men and women of reconciliation have always been, and are now, sure steps to our conversion. You are invited to join the community for these encounters with Mercy.

This week we celebrate the third and final Scrutiny with the Gospel story of the raising of Lazarus. Death is our greatest fear and this story reminds us that God's power and mercy are greater than ANY fear, sin or pain that we have in our lives. The Elect are asked to think about what needs to die in their lives in order for them to receive the new life being offered to them in baptism. For some, the question of whether they even want to come out of the tomb is important, whether they are willing to risk coming out into the light of Christ to see what awaits them. This week, they will also be presented with the Lord's Prayer, which teaches us that God loves as a loving father and will "give us...our daily bread" and "lead us from temptation." As they approach these last days of preparation before baptism, keep them in your prayers.

# Prayers And Squares Quilt Ministry Continues To Serve Our Community With Love

Prayers and Squares officially became a Chapter Member #1158 on October, 20, 2014. As a ministry, over 60 quilts have been made and presented, each a special gift of love and hope.

The beautiful quilts that you see in the back of our church are quilts made by our Prayers and Squares ministry team which meets on the first Tuesday of each month from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Parish Pastoral Center. If you want to join our ministry, please call the parish office at 206-935-0358. It does not matter if you have been a quilter for years or have no experience and just want to learn, please come and fellowship with some wonderful ladies who serve our community so faithfully.

Quilts become prayer quilts as a result of the prayers that are tied into them. When a request for a prayer quilt is made from a family, we ask for any special prayer intentions that we can make available for our community to pray for when tying the prayer knots. When the prayer quilt is presented, they can feel each prayer by all of the prayer knots that are tied just for them. Here is what you do:

- Pick up untied thread and make a square knot (right over left, then left over right). Pull the not firmly against the surface of the quilt.
- Offer a prayer for the person who will receive the quilt.
   Please remember that person in your regular prayers throughout the week.

## **Additional Ways To Pray During Lent**

What do we do when we're facing an upcoming big event, celebration, or special occasion in our lives? We prepare for it. Holy Week and Easter are "big events" in the liturgical year of the Church and in the spiritual life of a Christian. So, as Christians, we prepare spiritually for these through the forty days of Lent. This means that, during Lent, we rededicate ourselves to prayer. There are as many ways to pray as there are prayers in this world, but a few prayer methods can help us in particular to spiritually prepare ourselves during Lent:

- **Pray the Stations of the Cross**. One of the most common traditions of Lent is to pray the Stations of the Cross. This prayer helps us reflect on the passion and death of Christ in preparation for Good Friday observance and the Easter celebration. Check your local parish website or bulletin for listings of when a Stations of the Cross prayer service is being offered, or try one of the many online resources available.
- Meditate on Holy Scripture with Lectio Divina. Perhaps the oldest method of scriptural prayer known to Christians is Lectio Divina or "holy reading." This method of prayer is characterized by the slow reading and consideration of a text from Scripture, with repetition and meditation on key words or phrases. Lectio Divina is rooted in the belief that the scriptural word speaks in the human heart as the word of God and can reveal the thoughts of our hearts in response to God. In this way, Lectio Divina leads to a deeper communion with the Divine.
