From the *Pastor's Desk*



Dear Parishioners and Friends of Our Lady of Guadalupe,

I am writing you to share some thoughts about one of our largest ministries, our parish school. This ministry is something we all share in, whether we have children in the school or not, because the ministry of Catholic education is one of the ways we help to pass our Catholic faith on to the next generation, where we plant and nourish the seed of faith.

Our school provides a beacon of love, light, and hope in an increasingly dark world. It helps parents form their children in the gospel values that Jesus proclaimed. They learn about the love of God and neighbor, in addition to math, science, literature, writing, art and music. They are formed as people for others not in the selfish me-first attitudes that are currently so much in the fore of our society. Catholic schools have a long and proud tradition in the US, dating back to 1882 when the American bishops, meeting in Baltimore, set about to create a nationwide system of parish schools to foster Catholic values that were then under attack in the political climate of that time.

Our schools have evolved as times have changed, but they remain a place where the Gospel is proclaimed, and where children can grow in “age, wisdom, and grace” as scripture tells us Jesus did in Nazareth.

I invite every parish family with school age children to consider our parish school as their school. Our Lady of Guadalupe is not a private school for the few, it is a parish school for all our parish family and for those in our broader community who desire it. Parents, Grandparents, Aunts and Uncles, come and learn about our school. Make it known to the special children in your lives. Our school is pleased to offer tours to interested families; our principal Anton Kramer is ready to meet with you. Our school is now enrolling grades K-8 for the Fall term, as well as enrolling younger children in the expanded Early Learning Center that opens in September.

Observing our parish church on Easter Sunday brought me great joy. It was filled with the people of God, people of all ages, backgrounds and circumstances. But I was especially struck by the number of young families and the great number of children in our midst. We are so glad to have you among us! Bring these children to our parish school and help us to continue to develop a relevant, vibrant community, building on the vision and sacrifice of those who came before us.



On May 6th, from 9:30 a.m. to 10:45 a.m., we wish to invite all families to come and participate in our last Family Faith Sunday for this year. We will meet in the Walmsley Center Gym, where families will have lots of opportunities to participate in fun learning centers that will help us to know Mary better and learn to live more like her. Mary loves God, Jesus, and each of us intensely and always said “Yes” to God. She teaches us to follow Jesus, even when we face challenges in our lives.

By pronouncing her “fiat” at the Annunciation and giving her consent to the Incarnation, Mary was already collaborating with the whole work her Son was to accomplish. She is mother wherever He is Savior and head of the Mystical Body. The Most Blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of His Body. “We believe that the Holy Mother of God, the new Eve, Mother of the church, continues in heaven to exercise her maternal role on behalf of the members of Christ”. *Catechism of the Catholic church #973-974.*

Our Learning Centers Will Include Some Of The Following

One important devotion of our faith tradition is to reflect on the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the way that she loved others so fully, wearing her heart “on the outside”. We are all called to live this way too!

Our Lady, Undoer Of Knots - Pope Francis prays to Our Lady, Undoer of Knots. In the Church of St. Peter am Perlach in Augsburg Germany, there is a painting of Mary in heaven surrounded by angels. She holds a long ribbon and is untying a large knot, one of several on the ribbon. An angel on Mary's left is handing her a ribbon with many knots while an angel on her right is receiving a smooth ribbon with no knots. Have you ever tied a knot in your shoe lace and could not get it out? Mary can help us untie the knots that we face in our lives.

Our Lady of Guadalupe - In 1531, Mary made several appearances in Mexico, leading to one of the most popular Marian devotions. We will make a special candle in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Youth Migrant Project: Summer Mission Trip For Teens


