



From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we come to the end of the first month of my time here as pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe, I want to again thank everyone—staff and parishioners—for all the many expressions of welcome, support and assistance that have been extended to me through personal greetings, cards and letters, small gifts and treats, and the many signs of kindness and receptivity. You have all made me feel truly welcomed and embraced, and for this I am so very grateful.

As we move toward and into the month of August, please remember that Fr. Gary Zender, the Vicar for Clergy for the Archdiocese of Seattle, will be coming to OLG to celebrate our 11:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday, August 4th, and to “install” me at that Mass as the new pastor here. Fr. Zender is a good friend of mine, not only as a brother priest of the Archdiocese of Seattle, but also as a member of the same Jesu Caritas group that I belong to. This is a small group of priests—six of us to be exact—who meet once a month for prayer, fellowship and conversation about our ministries and spiritual lives. It will be both a great joy and a special privilege to be installed by Fr. Zender as the new pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

As I think I mentioned in my previous bulletin column, my two sisters, Barbara and Ann, will also be here for the installation, as will two of my nieces—Ann’s daughters, Catie and Maddie. That some members of my family will be here for the installation Mass will add to the joy of an already joyful occasion for me. I am so glad that you will be able to meet some of my immediate family, and they you.

As we continue to move further into the month of August, I will be taking a brief vacation to travel down to San Jose to visit my aging father and the rest of my family. My dad is approaching 94, and for some time has been facing some deteriorating and intensifying health conditions—arthritis, macular degeneration (blindness), and dementia. While he is well cared for via the attention and assistance of family members and medical professionals, he is facing greater and greater challenges and limitations with regard to his strength, his mobility, his eyesight and his memory. I want to make sure that I have the chance to see him, and to spend some time with him, as he confronts and copes with the constraints that more and more beset him. I would be grateful for your prayers for him. Francis Xavier (Frank) Duggan is his name. I will be in California from Sunday evening, August 18th, and returning to Seattle on Monday, August 26th. Word will be forthcoming as to who the priest(s) will be who will cover the weekend Masses on Saturday evening and Sunday morning, August 24th/25th, in my absence.

Update On Church's Sound System

As many of you know, the sound system in the church has been a challenge for years. The water tower across the street and the changes made in the US broadband system often interferes with our wireless system. In addition, for the last year, we have been waiting for a signal booster that would improve the quality of the sound, but due to the Chinese tariffs that equipment is not available. So, we are going to plan B by installing a new receiver in the Church. We are currently getting a proposal as to the cost and hope to have the situation resolved by the end of the summer. Urge Congress to Fund Gun Violence Research

Gun violence kills 100 people, and injures hundreds more, every day in our country. Over 20 years ago, the NRA fought aggressively to persuade Congress to block funding for gun violence research, and, as a result, *funding for gun injury prevention fell by over 90 percent over the last two decades.* Now, the House Appropriations Committee has allocated \$50 million in a 2020 House spending bill for Fiscal Year 2020 to study both the causes of gun violence and the solutions to help prevent it. 50th Anniversary of Earth Day October 1st at 7:00 p.m. Walmesley Center

To mark the Season of Creation, the Green Ministry of OLG and Holy Rosary will host a panel discussion on the relevance and importance of Earth Day as we approach the 50th anniversary of this event next April. St Vincent de Paul Society

During June, members of St. Vincent de Paul helped 141 people with food, goods and services amounting to \$10,312.49. This has included providing clothing, hygiene items, medicine, medical treatment, bus tickets, rent, utilities, and household goods. Over 65 people were kept from being homeless because St. Vincent's helped pay their rent or provided a motel room. Others got help with their utilities. Because of the increasing cost of housing in the Seattle Area, more people are asking for help with their rent and utility payments. Please be as generous as you can in St. Vincent's collection of food and donations and keep these members in your prayers as they follow Christ's words...*"feed the hungry, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless."* Financial Report: 6/1/19 to 6/30/19

- Our opening balance on 6/1/19 was \$1,741.54
- Income for June was \$13,225: \$12,325 from the Parish collections; \$800 from all other sources. Expenses were \$8,565.19 which included \$6,868 for rent. All other expenses totaled \$1,697.19.
- Our closing balance as of 6/30/19 was \$6,374.05 with outstanding pledge liabilities of \$2,694 which left us with an available cash balance of \$3,680.05.


Summer Film Festival


