

## From the Pastor's Desk



My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In this beautiful time of year, as the seasons change, we traditionally take time to consider our roles as stewards in our parish community. We reflect upon how our gifts of time, talent and treasure are essential components in making our faith community here at Our Lady of Guadalupe work. In one of his first messages to us, Archbishop Etienne reminded us :

***“ Catholics live in community with each other.”***

When we offer our gifts of time, talent and treasure, we build up our faith community, the place where together we live out our faith life. As a community, we make our witness to those around us. The community will be stronger or weaker, depending on the willingness of its members to share what they possess with each other. In this spirit, I ask you to begin considering your engagement in and support of our parish at OLG.


