



## From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With the Christmas season concluding last Sunday with our celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and simultaneously beginning the period of Ordinary Time, we offer a huge and most sincere expression of our gratitude to the many people and groups who made our Christmas season so beautiful and prayerful, especially in connection with our celebrations of the Masses for the Nativity of the Lord on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day; the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God on New Year's Day; the Feasts of the Holy Family, of the Epiphany of the Lord and of the Baptism of the Lord. We say thank you to Ann Sager and the many cantors, musicians and choir members who supplied our music ministry and led our singing; to Helen Oesterle and the many Altar Servers, Readers, Communion Ministers and Ushers who assisted through exercise of the liturgical ministries they offered; to the Art and Environment Committee and the many volunteers who helped to adorn our church for the Christmas season by decorating the trees and wreaths, by setting up the manger scene and by arranging the poinsettias and sanctuary appointments; to Sal Pagan and the volunteers who helped with the setting up of the many extra chairs and maintaining the cleanliness of our restrooms; to those who assisted with the needs of hospitality and welcome, and to our parish staff who went the extra mile in a number of ways to ensure that all was ready for the Yuletide season at OLG. To all who pitched in and put forth effort, and to all who participated and supplied help, we say, "Well done, good and faithful servants! Thanks, thanks and ever thanks!!"

As we move into Ordinary Time in the current liturgical year (Year A for our Sunday Masses) I would encourage parishioners to take the time to read the Gospel According to Saint Matthew, and to make an effort to get (more) acquainted with Jesus as he is presented to us in Matthew's account of the Good News. This gospel is 28 chapters in length. If one were to read a chapter a day, one could get through the entire gospel in less than a month. Five Sundays between now and the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday (26<sup>th</sup> February 2020) will feature gospel readings from Saint Matthew—January 26<sup>th</sup>, February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. And we will return to Matthew's Gospel after the seasons of Lent and Easter, and will proclaim this gospel at our Sunday Masses from mid-June through late-November, for virtually the entire second half of the 2020 Liturgical Year. Matthew's Gospel is the most Jewish of all the four (canonical) gospels in the New Testament. Reading this gospel will give one some idea of the ways in which Christians of Jewish background viewed and understood Jesus.




