



From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The current fiscal year (1st July 2019 – 30th June 2020) has already been a time of significant change and transition for the parish community of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church. A beloved, dedicated and gifted pastor of 17 years, Fr. Jack Walmsley, retired and a new pastor, Fr. Kevin Duggan, was appointed by Archbishop Peter Sartain to take over the helm. Peggy Behnken stepped down as our Office Administrative Assistant after years of talented and skilled ministry and was replaced by Marla Petronzio whose knowledge and abilities have already begun to benefit us. Paulina Alvarado stepped away from her role as our Infant Baptism Coordinator in order to pursue chaplaincy certification through the Clinical Pastoral Education program at St. Joseph Medical Center in Tacoma. Jennifer Wong has been hired to step in as our new Baptism Coordinator and will be assuming her duties in the near future.

More recently Pete Shepherd, our Pastoral Assistant for Administration (PAA), has formally announced his decision to retire beginning in February 2020, and OLG has been in the process of trying to recruit and bring on board someone who can step into this position and fill the bill as our new PAA. I am delighted to report that our efforts have borne fruit and that an experienced and highly capable person, Michelle Scheving, has been found to assume the PAA role at OLG beginning also in February 2020.

Pete has been the PAA at OLG for a few years now and has done the parish a great and valuable service in really helping us to reorganize and improve our fiscal policies and financial health. He is definitely leaving the parish in better fiscal shape than when he first came on board. For this we are so grateful and so blessed. We wish Pete well as he steps (for the third time!) into his retirement. (He stepped out of retirement to come and help right the ship when he came on board here at OLG!) We thank him and wish him well in all that awaits him.

Likewise, we welcome Michelle Scheving as she steps next month into her position as our new PAA. Michelle comes to us as someone already well acquainted with OLG, especially in the areas she has been a part of in relation to OLG School, where she has held a number of positions in conjunction with the School Parent Organization—Fundraiser Chair, Secretary, Treasurer and Auction Co-Chair. Michelle has substantial experience in the world of non-profit organizations and brings an energetic enthusiasm to her new duties as our PAA at OLG. We welcome Michelle and are so glad she has accepted our invitation to join our staff.


