

From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

At our Masses last weekend, February 1st/2nd, I shared with all of you the announcement about the death of Archbishop Emeritus Alexander Brunett that we had received from Archbishop Paul Etienne and the Chancery. As of the writing of this edition of my Pastor's Bulletin Column, no date has yet been set for Archbishop Brunett's Funeral Mass. As soon as this information is made known, we will begin getting word out to our parishioners through the various communication channels available. For now, I ask you all simply to pray for the repose of the soul of Archbishop Brunett. May he rest in peace.

I also want to let folks know that I will be away from the parish this next weekend, February 15th/16th, and into the following week. I am again flying down to San Jose, California, to visit my Dad, my siblings and my nieces and nephews. I leave on Friday evening, February 14th, and will be returning to Seattle on the afternoon of Thursday, February 20th. I will be resuming my regular duties on Saturday, February 22nd. Please keep me in your prayers while I am away. Please know that you all will be in mine.

On Saturday morning, February 22nd, I will again be offering a training session for our Readers at OLG, as well as for any individuals interested in learning more about this ministry of proclaiming God's Word in the liturgical assembly of God's people. The workshop is also open to anyone who would simply like to learn more about the Sacred Scriptures and their relationship to the Mass wherein they are proclaimed. This workshop is open to everyone. All are welcome.

Finally, just to be sure that everyone is tracking its approach as it draws near, the season of Lent begins on Wednesday, February 26th, with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. There will be three opportunities that day to receive ashes. There will be a service of the Word of God at 6:30 a.m., and two celebrations of the Mass, one at 9:00 a.m. and another at 7:00 p.m. Ashes will be distributed at each of these three liturgies.

Loving God, Help me to protect your creations because they are shared by the world. My small acts have a huge impact.



The experience of sickness, long-term illness and aging changes our lives. As a church, we care for one another and we support the sick by our presence and our prayers.


What is the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church. Like the sacrament of Reconciliation (confession), it is a sacrament of healing. Our understanding of this sacrament has changed with time. In the early Church, it was seen as a sacrament of healing, but later it came to be known as “Extreme Unction” – literally, “last anointing” – and was not administered until death was imminent. With the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, the Church has returned to the more ancient practice with regard to this sacrament. For more information, go our website: www.olgseattle.org.

Who can receive this Sacrament?

Catholics, both children and adults, who are seriously ill, facing surgery, or experiencing the weakness that comes with old age should seek this sacrament.

Volunteers Needed To Help With First Communion Banners & Altar Cloth


