## ***“Hope In Action”***

Gratitude is a powerful virtue. It opens our hearts and minds to recognize God, who is the source of all goodness, in everything—the good and the bad. This makes it possible for us to move forward with hope, knowing that God is in our midst and we are not alone. As this past Sunday’s readings remind us, God is always setting before us a feast, where everything we need is provided and where all tears are wiped away and death is destroyed. God is always at work creating something new, bringing light to darkness, transforming our despair to hope! That is not only true in our personal lives, but also here in our parish.

Some of you have shared that it has been hard to feel connected to your faith and our parish community during this time of COVID. You might think that since we cannot come to church for Mass, everything is on hold. But the truth is that our parish is still being Church when we gather in our homes to live-stream Mass: the Word of God and the Eucharist continue to feed us. Although it is different from what we are used to, our parish is still very much alive and active. We continue to be Church when our SVdP volunteers still visit people’s homes; our sacramental prep classes, parish school, and Sunday School programs continue to take place; our parish leadership groups still meet, small groups still gather for prayer and Scripture study; and our seniors and those homebound are being cared for through our Angel Buddy ministry - and for all of this and more, we give thanks!

But there is more that we can do, and all of us, no matter our different circumstances, are invited to continue the work of building God’s kingdom within our families, our parish, and in the world. With gratitude in our hearts, we can say “yes” to that invitation, for God continues to set before us a feast providing for all that we need. And nothing can stop us, not even a global pandemic, because we are people of hope. So, I invite you to be part of what we are calling, “Hope in Action”. Some suggestions include:

- Begin each day with a prayer that your heart and mind will be open to the blessings and invitations of the day before you—no matter how small—and then give thanks.
- Participate regularly in our public and live-streaming Masses. Our parish needs the gifts you bring, and we can provide support, inspiration and comfort to each other.
- Find ways to help others, such as donating food and/or money, becoming an Angel Buddy to our seniors, or advocating for important issues of justice.
- In addition, I encourage you to participate in the upcoming “Fireside Chats with Fr. Kevin”, where you will have an opportunity to connect with other parishioners and participate in conversations about the future of our parish. We don’t have all the answers to the questions before us, but together, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we can live into those answers.

So, I invite all of us to recommit ourselves to Jesus Christ and to each other. For I believe that together, we, as Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, can help each other find the courage, strength and hope to be faithful to our yes! That together we can help each other negotiate these challenging times and support each other in our loss and pain and doubt. I strongly believe, that in sharing this journey together, we can emerge from these very difficult times stronger in our faith and our love for each other, and more committed to share in the work of building the Kingdom of God here on earth.

Touch my soul with your compassion for others.



## **Racism and Voting**

In the November 2018 pastoral letter against racism, Open Wide Our Hearts, the Catholic bishops of the United States urge all Catholics to acknowledge “the scourge of racism” that still exists in our heart, words, actions, and institutions. Racism can be individual, when persons fail to recognize certain groups as created in the image and likeness of God and equal in dignity, or it can be systemic, where practices or policies treat certain groups of people unjustly. One example of systemic racism is lack of access to the vote for some communities of color.

The Church teaches that all persons have both a legal right and a responsibility to have their voice heard in the public square to promote human dignity and the common good of society...We also must act to ensure that the right to vote is protected for all citizens. This has often been threatened for many minorities in the U.S.

Sixty years ago, the United States Commission on Civil Rights documented a history of pervasive discrimination toward minorities in all aspects of voting, despite the 1870 Fifteenth Amendment that prohibits denying citizens the right to vote because of “race, color, or previous condition of servitude.” Since the 1870s, threats of violence and actual violence, especially in the South, has been used to discourage African Americans from voting. Government officials openly opposed minority voting. For example, U.S. Senator Theodore Bilbo of Mississippi called for Klansmen to visit African Americans the night before elections to send a message that they should not try to vote...Literacy tests were another systematic attempt to deny voters of color access to the voting booth...Some of these test were designed so no one could pass, such as demands to recite the entire U.S. Constitution or to count the bubbles in a bar of soap to prove math abilities. Gerrymandering, the practice of redrawing voting district boundaries, was historically used to suppress the African American vote.

The injustices prompted the Voting Rights Act of 1965, which was initially successful in eliminating many of the barriers to voting for minorities. However, a 2018 Report by the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights detailed a decline in the Act’s enforcement. The report suggests Latino Americans, Native Americans, and African Americans are facing new barriers to voting. Some Catholic voices are raising concerns about voter identification laws seen in many states in recent years....State Catholic Conferences have also been vocal about other issues related to access to voting, including gerrymandering and restoration of voting rights. Others raise concerns about restrictions on early voting, lack of local and accessible registration opportunities and precinct voting locations.

Today, too many barriers to the right to vote remain...In response, we are called to work to ensure that all are able to exercise their rights, as faithful citizens, to raise their voices in the public square.



### Catholic Relief Services:

#### Call On Congress To Fight COVID-19 Overseas

A coalition of faith-based organizations is asking Congress to take immediate action to fund efforts to fight the COVID-19 pandemic overseas. "If we don't beat COVID-19 everywhere, we can't beat it anywhere," said Catholic Relief Services, one of the letter's signatories, in a recent press release. CRS is urging an authorization of \$10-15 billion, which equates to about 0.005% of the \$3 trillion Congress has authorized so far for domestic pandemic relief. The letter stated, "At this critical moment, we cannot turn our back on our brothers and sisters around the world. As a nation, we have both the ability and obligation to provide resources which will prevent the worldwide spread of this disease and alleviate the suffering of those afflicted – and in so doing, we are certain it will also protect us here at home as well."
