

## Pastor's Page



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Lent began for us on Ash Wednesday with the reception on our foreheads of the ashes signifying our mortality and our repentance for our sins. The two options for the words spoken to us as the ashes are given express this two-fold significance. The first option reminds us that Christ calls us to turn away from sin and to turn in faith to him: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." The second option calls us to remember our mortal nature and the inevitability of death that we all must face: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Last week for the Third Sunday of Lent, we heard Jesus urging us to repent lest we too suffer the death-dealing consequences of our sins. Twice he warned the people who were listening to him, "I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did." Turning from sin to receive the grace and mercy of God is a central and repeated aspect of Lent. The message calling us to "metanoia" and offering us the medicine of God's mercy is a many-faceted refrain as Lent unfolds.

One of the ways in which this penitential aspect of Lent is proclaimed and celebrated is through Reconciliation (Penance) Services wherein God's People gather to acknowledge our sins in a spirit of repentance, and to pray together for the mercy and forgiveness God bestows. The second of our **Lenten Communal Penance** services is set for this coming **Wednesday, March 30<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 p.m.** We hope you will join us as we gather to listen to the Sacred Scriptures, to reflect upon the reality of sin in our lives and in our world, and to prayerfully seek the healing remedy of God's mercy for ourselves and for all who suffer from sin's destructive influence.

Remember also that opportunities to celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** are also available through the **private confessions** that are available here at OLG. Such confessions are heard on a regular weekly basis on Saturday afternoons from 4:15 – 5:00 p.m. in the Reconciliation Chapel in our church. I will also make myself available to hear private confessions following the **March 30<sup>th</sup> Communal Reconciliation Service** listed above, and on **Wednesday, April 13<sup>th</sup> (6:00 – 7:30 p.m.)** during Holy Week.

## Journey Of The Elect

This week we celebrate the second of the three Scrutinies with the story of the prodigal son. But actually, it is a story about two prodigal sons. This Gospel challenges our Elect, and ourselves, to reflect more deeply upon our lives, with particular focus on the gifts of God that we have squandered and that has led us into a messy spiritual “pigsty”, and/or the intolerance we have for other people’s mistakes and the need for reconciliation. Later this week, the Elect will be presented with our Creed. The Church “lovingly entrust to them...this ancient text that has always been regarded as expressing the heart of the Church’s faith and prayer.” The Creed is presented to enlighten the Elect and it recalls the wonderful deeds of God for the salvation of the human race. The Elect are to commit the Creed to memory and will recite it publicly on Holy Saturday. Continue to enter into these solemn rites in prayer with our Elect as they prepare for baptism, Eucharist and confirmation, and to pray for them every day, for your prayers do make a difference!






**What is it?**

CRS Rice Bowl is Catholic Relief Services’ Lenten faith-in-action program for families and faith communities. It offers simple, yet powerful, ways for every one of our parishes, most of our schools, and families throughout western Washington to bring Lenten spirituality to life.

Every Lent, Catholics here and throughout the U.S. do something amazingly holy and just. Our prayers, fasting and almsgiving become lifesaving aid for millions of individuals living in conditions of poverty around the world. The hungry are fed; the thirsty are given drink; immigrants and refugees are served; the homeless find shelter.

The CRS Collection is one of the twelve national collections established by the bishops of the United States and represents our community of faith at work in the world. The CRS Collection theme, *Help Jesus in disguise*, reminds us of the presence of Christ in every one of our brothers and sisters in need.

The bishops encourage us to view the national collection in the light of stewardship and sharing. It is right and just that we give something back, helping people in our nation and worldwide to live better and grow in the love of Jesus.

**When does it happen?**

Rice Bowl begins on **Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022** and ends with **Easter Sunday, April 17, 2022**

The national date for the CRS Collection is always Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent. This year, the CRS Collection lands on **March 27, 2022**.

**Who Benefits?**

Rice Bowl contributions support projects that assist our sisters and brothers in need, both overseas and here in the United States. 75 percent of Rice Bowl contributions are sent to Catholic Relief Services and help fund development projects overseas that help increase and maintain communities’ access to food. 25 percent of the contributions fund local poverty and hunger alleviation programs in dioceses in the U.S. No administrative expense is taken out of your donation.

The CRS Collection supports six Catholic organizations (Catholic Relief Services; the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ Department of Justice, Peace, and Human Development; Migration and Refugee Services, its Catholic Legal Immigration Network Inc., its Secretariat for Cultural Diversity in the Church; and the Holy Father’s Relief Fund) that advance the international social ministry of the Catholic Church.
