



Tabernacle Project Update

Thank you to all the amazing parishioners and OLG friends who supported last year's Annual Catholic Appeal parish project. We raised \$60,000 to create a sacred and proper space in the church for our tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved. This space will also be used for



prayer and adoration. Before we prepare to launch the 2022 Annual Catholic Appeal, we wanted to provide an update on where we are with last year's project which was delayed a bit due to Covid. A Steering Committee was formed with representatives from the parish and Liturgy Commission. The Steering Committee selected an architect and reviewed several potential design options. A concept was agreed upon. The implementation team is finalizing the last details and pricing out materials. Look for more information regarding the specifics of this exciting project in late April/early May.



Family Activity:

A special family activity during the Easter season can be to work together to create an Easter candle for your home. Get a large white candle, and use stickers, permanent markers, glitter paint, and other available arts and crafts supplies along with natural materials to decorate the candle with the name of each family member and symbols of Easter and new life. Keep the candle on your prayer table or a special place in your home, from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. As you light this candle as a family, it will remind you that the Light of Christ will never go out in your home.

You can light your family Easter candle during family meals or during family prayer times. You can add to your family prayers an Easter proclamation such as, "Christ is Risen! Alleluia! He is truly Risen!"


