

Pastor's Page



Dear Friends Christ,

By the time you read this edition of my weekly Pastor's Bulletin Column, I will be in the California Bay Area to help my family celebrate my niece Catie's undergraduate commencement from the University of California at Berkeley. We are so very proud of her accomplishment in graduating *summa cum laude!* While I would love to say that she is taking after her Uncle Kevin in this respect....well, let's just say that there are other ways in which she takes after him far more closely.

I will be gone until the weekend of the 6th Sunday of Easter (May 21st/22nd). While I am away, Fr. Bill Cleary of the Redemptorist Community will be covering the weekend Masses that I will miss (May 14th/15th), and several members of our Liturgy Commission will be leading weekday Word and Communion Services on the Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays that I will be away (May 11th – 13th and May 18th – 20th). I wish to thank sincerely all those individuals, clergy as well as laity, for the ministry and service they will be providing you while I am gone. Their gifts, skills, knowledge and generous assistance are deeply appreciated. The parish community and all its households will be in my prayers throughout my time away.

I wish to update everyone on the progress of our Tabernacle project at OLG. This project is the one being funded through contributions made by individual parishioners, and by funds gathered from the rebate we have been receiving from last year's Annual Catholic Appeal (2021). A total of approximately \$60,000 was raised through these two channels, and these funds have been put to work in the design and construction of our new Tabernacle "chapel" here at OLG in the southwest corner of the church.

While the design has been completed, the construction/installation phase has just barely begun. Delays in the shipping and manufacture of the materials has been slowed due to all the constraints caused by the COVID pandemic, but we have begun to layout the space with temporary floor markings, and we have put together a display board to give folks a visual sense of the materials that will be used for the various aspects of the overall project—curtains, flooring, chairs, lighting, etc. Please stop by the southwest corner of the church to take a look. Also, please be patient as the work proceeds, as it will entail some modest interruption in how this portion of our church is used. Also, please continue to pray for the success of the project, for the safety of those who handle the construction, and for the smooth progress and timely completion of the work.

However, due to the pastoral needs of providing communion to all the faithful, the Church authorizes special ministers who will be able to distribute communion at Mass and to persons who are sick and/or homebound. Eucharistic Ministers must be fully initiated into the Church, having celebrated baptism, confirmation and First Communion. 
Celebrating Mary During The Month Of May







"Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and Hallelujah is our song."

Cynicism is easy in our day and age, as is skepticism and doubt. It's almost our default. But Eastertide is about joy. Not any type of joy, but a particular joy: joy in the resurrection. As a family, over the Easter season, consider what practices you can implement into your life to cultivate more joy. Our cities and the world need to see our joy as much as they need to see our fasting and sacrifice. In a world abundant with hopelessness and purposelessness, the surprising, unexpected joy of the resurrection is the antidote. If you're short on ideas, here's a few suggestions for cultivating joy:

Abide with Jesus: Make [John 15:1-17](#) your meditation for the remaining Easter season days. It will change your life, I promise. Jesus wants us to abide in him—he wants us to abide in his love. It's simpler than it sounds. We keep his commandments. The first command is to believe in him ([John 6:29](#), [1 John 3:23](#)), and the second is to love each other ([John 15:12](#)). Believe in him, love others with his love. Got it? Jesus taught us to abide in his love so that "my joy may be in you, and your joy may be full" ([John 15:11](#)). Take 15 minutes every morning to abide with Jesus, to pray, to seek him, to ask him how to love those around you—and his promise is joy ... plentiful joy.

♦ **OFFICE COORDINATOR** This person will be responsible for the efficient and effective office operations that support the parish's ministries and activities. The ideal candidate creates a welcoming and caring environment for all who contact the office, whether in person, by phone, or email. In addition, this person must have a sense of the workings of a Catholic parish. This is a 40 hour per week position and salary range is \$20-\$24/hour DOE. Seeking candidates with good organizational skills, and the ability to prioritize and keep moving forward in the midst of daily distractions.




