

Dear Friends in Christ,

The tragic and horrifying news of the recent shooting in Buffalo, New York, has once again brought intense sorrow and justifiable outrage to our sisters and brothers in the African American community, and to all people of color who suffer the violent and malicious prejudices of those whose minds and hearts have been corrupted by racism. We offer our prayers, our pledges of solidarity and our promises to keep working with them for the conversion of ideological racism and the dismantling of institutionalized racism.

The early Church, as depicted in the Acts of the Apostles, describes a movement that started out as a religious and cultural phenomenon that was fairly narrow and limited in its self-understanding and sense of mission. The first believers in Jesus were, like Jesus himself, of Palestinian-Jewish origin and outlook. But with the coming of the Holy Spirit who began to guide the early Church to an ever fuller understanding of the truth Jesus had taught them, they began to see and to understand that the life Jesus had won for them by his own Death and Resurrection was a life that included the whole human race to the broadest and most inclusive degree. It was to include both Jews <u>and</u> Gentiles—in other words, people of all the races, cultures, nations, tribes and tongues who make up the human family.

This understanding of the mission Jesus has entrusted to his Church, and therefore of the mind of Christ himself, is one of the major reasons, though by no means the only such reason, why we as Christians find racism, morally, intellectually and spiritually unacceptable. It is incompatible with the Gospel we are called to faithfully profess and to lovingly share. There are times when we can easily succumb to something of a fatalistic attitude, an attitude wherein we begin to doubt that we can make a difference, and due to which we quit trying. The temptation to give in to such an attitude comes from the evil one himself. Like the parable of the mustard seed and the yeast, tiny and almost unnoticeable contributions can have a dramatic effect, especially in the long run. The first apostles were a tiny band of twelve imperfect but faith-filled individuals, but they began a movement that eventually brought the Roman Empire to conversion. On our part and in our day we can pray, we can vote, we can speak up and we can examine ourselves. We can be the change that we want to effect in our society, in our nation and in our world. As with the first apostles and with the saints of every time and place, we can undergo and embrace the transformative power of the Gospel by giving ourselves to Christ in faith. We can do nothing, and thereby remain part of the problem, or we can do something, and thereby allow God to use us to become part of the solution.



On Memorial Day, we honor all Americans who gave their lives for their country. Flags fly at half-mast and flowers and flags are used to decorate the graves of soldiers who died in battle. Memorial Day is also called Decoration Day because of the tradition of decorating the graves of service men and women. This tradition started with the Gettysburg Address during the Civil War. In modern times, Memorial Day is also called Poppy Day.


Family Activities during Memorial Day:

- As a family, take a Memorial walk in your neighborhood and look for flags that may be at half-mast, or small ones in yards. Discuss on your walk, what other things might you see that reminds you of Memorial Day?
- Tie blooming branches with ribbon around the flagpole as a remembrance for those who have died. Lilacs and other fruit trees are usually blooming.
- Cut out a cross from tag board and write on the center of the cross: "Living with Jesus." Write the names of the people who have died in your family and place on your prayer table.


