



Pastor's Page



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With this Sunday's celebration of the Solemnity of Pentecost, we reach the end of the great 50 days of the Easter Season—a week of weeks plus one day! While the Church's liturgical tradition takes us back into Ordinary Time for the nearly six months remaining in the current Liturgical Year (early June – late November), the first two Sundays following Pentecost are themselves important Sundays meant to help us be mindful of what Easter has revealed, and of the sacramental mystery that sustains us throughout the life-long journey of faith that draws us more deeply into our participation in the life of God.

The first Sunday following Pentecost—June 12th this year—is Trinity Sunday. The Liturgy focuses upon the Christian understanding of God who is revealed as somehow simultaneously one and three, both a unity and a diversity, who share in a full but unconfused and inseparable communion—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This is the self-disclosure God (the Father) has made to us in the Incarnation, Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ (the Son) that is accomplished in and through the power of the Advocate (the Holy Spirit) given to us at Pentecost, the Spirit that leads us into all truth, and through whom the Father and the Son come to abide in us and we in them.

June 19th, the second Sunday following Pentecost, is the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ—a.k.a., Corpus Christi. Here too, it is the mystery of the Triune God present and at work to give us that spiritual food and drink (the Body and Blood of Christ) needed to sustain our earthly pilgrimage to that heavenly life that will entail our full and complete communion in the life of God—the one God who is a communion of three Divine Persons.

These two Sundays, Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi, are celebrations which give consummate expression to the mystery of who God is, what God has done for us, and where God is leading and drawing us. They focus on the mysteries that are central and foundational to our Catholic and Christian faith, and to the lives that we are called to live as those who believe themselves to be “the People of God” and “the Body of Christ”. May our celebration of these two post-Pentecost solemnities fill us with joy and gratitude, and make us ever more receptive and responsive to God's presence and action in our lives.

Family Reflection Questions:

As a family, discuss if you have ever stood up or defended another person? How did it make you feel?

Do you ever pray to the Holy Spirit?

Teach your kids a prayer to the Holy Spirit.

Here is a simple prayer to the Holy Spirit as a family:

Come, Holy Spirit, fill our hearts and enkindle in us your love. Send forth your Spirit, today and every day. O God, by the light of the Holy Spirit, instruct our hearts as your faithful people, and grant us wisdom to serve you. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


Here are some family activities for Pentecost:

Fly a kite, make a windsock, play with balloons.

Little kids will enjoy making a tradition of flying kites or making Spirit-themed windsocks on Pentecost. Better yet, make your own kite, and incorporate Pentecost imagery.

Another super-easy craft is to get bags of red and white balloons; blow them up and play a balloon-catch game or string them together to make a symbol of the Holy Spirit.

Wear Red as a family to Mass on the Solemnity of Pentecost. Also, decorate your prayer table with red flowers and table dressing.

Of the 185 people exonerated from death row since 1973, about 53% are black. Today, the states that sentence the most people to death are the same states that once carried out the most lynchings. 
