## Pastor's Page



Dear Friends in Christ,

As most of you here at OLG have been learning over the course of the past several months, there are some significant changes and adjustments occurring in the ranks of our parish staff. Specifically, the changes pertain to the following people and positions:

**Marion Kari**, our PA for Family Faith Formation and Pastoral Care, is taking a well-deserved retirement at the end of this month (June 2022) after many years of outstanding and fruitful ministry at OLG.

**Jennifer Ibach**, our PA for Outreach and Young Adult Ministry has decided to accept a new position with the parish cluster in South Seattle—St. George, St. Edward, St. Peter and St. Paul—as their Pastoral Associate. This is a wonderful opportunity for her vocationally and professionally.

**Marla Petronzio** recently decided to step down from her position as Office Manager due to increasingly difficult challenges regarding her commute to OLG on the ferry all the way from Port Orchard, WA, where she and her family live.

**Sal Pagan**, our Facilities Supervisor, and **Gail Neudorfer**, our Bookkeeper, have both been on extended leave due to important health related matters they have long been facing. We can't wait to have them back in our midst.

In none of these cases have the changes been due to the person's dissatisfaction with their job, disagreements with their fellow employees, or discontent with the parish at large or anyone in it. The changes are entirely due to other factors—retirement, vocational discernment, family needs or health situations. In each case, the person in question would otherwise have wanted to stay here and continue serving OLG were it not for these other factors that induced or necessitated their decision to step down or take some time away. In the cases of Marion, Jennifer and Marla, we are either looking for qualified and gifted replacements and/or have already begun to “reshuffle the deck” in regard to the distribution of staff duties and ministries. This remains a work in progress, though some good progress has already been made. Our parish staff remains a collaborative group of folks, a team dedicated to serving the parish and to helping one another. We are sad to say good-bye to the ones who are leaving us and are eager to have with us once again the two who are on leave, but we are hopeful for the future and seeking to find ministers who can step in and fill the positions that need to be filled. Please pray that God will guide our efforts and make them fruitful.


For those of you who are new to our community, we have a Prayer Quilt Ministry, where anyone in our community can receive a prayer quilt to support them in any challenge or loss they are experiencing. As beautiful as the prayer quilts are, the most important aspect of them are the prayer knots that are tied as an intentional prayer offered for the person receiving them.

Recently, a prayer quilt was given to a woman who was facing back surgery, and after a disappointing day of not having her procedure as scheduled, when she got home, her quilt was waiting for her. Her reaction and comment was *"I have never had anyone do something so nice for me."*

Fr. Kevin, in his homily on the Solemnity of Pentecost, invited each of us to pray to the Holy Spirit daily. He referred to the prayer on the back of the Breaking Bread song book as a simple prayer we are all familiar with:

#### Come, Holy Spirit

## History of Holy Land Handicrafts

The handicrafts trade in the Holy Land has evolved as a cultural tradition of the Holy land people over many centuries and has become an industry of significance to the local economy. Beautiful handmade souvenirs made from the native olive tree provide Christian pilgrims with cherished memorials of their holy pilgrimage. Olivewood artisans use only the pruned and discarded pieces of young olive trees and sprouts from the old, unproductive trees. The artistry of Mother-of-Pearl is a tradition traced to the earth 17th century and has evolved along with the olivewood trade.



The ancient crafts of olivewood and Mother-of-Pearl started in Bethlehem hundreds of years ago when Franciscan monks trained the local population in carving Crosses, crucifixes, and reproductions of the Nativity scene of Jesus birth in Bethlehem and the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem. The demand for souvenirs from the Holy Land can be traced to the early centuries of Christianity and the tradition of relic hunters. For centuries, early Christians believed in the spiritual powers of relics, the most sought after being The Holy Grail—the name of a legendary sacred vessel identified with the chalice of the Eucharist—and The True Cross, the actual cross on which Christ was crucified, believed to have been lost when carried into battle during one of the Crusades. Centuries later, Christians learned to satisfy their hunger for relics with other artifacts from the Holy Land, including ordinary stones which have been transported to every part of the earth by pilgrims.

The proceeds are to support Christian Catholic families in the Holy Land since it is the major source of income for them there. We got our wares from more than 75 families in Bethlehem . They are very beautiful and unique items. *(Nativities, Crucifixes, Rosaries, Statues)*. The Christian population has dropped from 22% to less than 2% in the past two decades. And this is a way to support them stay there.





◆ **PASTORAL ASSISTANT FOR SOCIAL OUTREACH** This person will coordinate the social outreach and advocacy efforts of the parish and be a resource for those in need in the community. This is a 20 hour per week position and salary range is \$22-\$24/hour DOE. Hours are flexible.

◆ **PASTORAL ASSISTANT FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILY FAITH FORMATION.** This person will develop, implement, and direct Faith Formation Programs for preschool and elementary children and their families including co-directing Vacation Bible Camp. In addition, this person will coordinate the Sacramental Preparation Programs for First Reconciliation, First Communion and RCIA for Older Children. Interested candidates should have a passion for evangelization and enthusiasm for forming the faith of young children and families. This is a 30-35 hour per week position plus benefits and salary range is \$25-\$28/hour DOE. Hours are flexible but must be able to work most Sundays during the school year until 1pm. Position open until filled.

The massive spring bird migration is taking place right over our heads, as we live in the path of the Pacific Flyway. Every year, billions of birds migrate north in the spring and south in the fall, most of them flying at night, navigating with the night sky. However, they can become disoriented by bright artificial lights and skyglow, often causing them to collide with buildings or windows. Bird fatalities are also caused by the amount of energy the birds waste flying around and calling out in confusion. The exhaustion can then leave them vulnerable to other urban threats.
