## ***Pastor's Page***



Dear Friends in Christ,

On Saturday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m., representatives of OLG's leadership and consultative bodies—parish staff, pastoral council, finance council, and school commission—will be gathering for a time of prayer, discussion and discernment related to matters of importance to OLG. We will be striving to put the final touches to a new OLG Mission Statement that articulates the heart of who we are and what we are called to do as disciples of Jesus Christ here in West Seattle. We will be talking about our part in a broader deanery and archdiocesan effort to help craft and implement a long-range pastoral and strategic plan to ensure effective ministry and pastoral care for us and for all the parishes and faith communities of Western Washington.

As we navigate and negotiate all the transitions and opportunities that this task will involve, I ask you all to please pray for our OLG Parish Leadership, and for our Archdiocesan Catholic Church in Western Washington. As nearly all Catholics are aware, the whole of the Universal Church is confronting and undertaking an effort to respond faithfully, wisely, fruitfully, and prudently to matters that are highly important and consequential, to say nothing of controversial. Amongst these issues are the decreasing number of ordained priests and lay ecclesial ministers that are available for service, the decline in attendance at Mass on the part of many Catholics, the dwindling commitment to the Catholic faith that is evident amongst younger Catholics, the continuing fallout from the clergy sexual-abuse scandal, the role of women in the areas of Church ministry and leadership, questions regarding long-standing Catholic teachings in the realm of sexuality, and strong cultural influences that challenge and even condemn not only Christianity and Catholicism, but the general practice and place of religion in the lives of human beings.

In the Archdiocese of Seattle, an effort is just getting underway to put together a long-range strategic and pastoral plan, and to engage Catholics in Western Washington in helping to discern and design the plan, at least certain aspects and elements of it. Archbishop Paul Etienne, the pastor of our archdiocesan Catholic community, is asking us to reflect upon and to respond to the challenges and questions that we are all facing in our lives as Catholic disciples of Jesus Christ. Drawing upon the example set by Pope Francis in his calling of the Worldwide Synod, Archbishop Etienne, is asking us to discern together how we might, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, effectively face the challenges and questions that confront our archdiocesan Church, our deaneries, our parishes and our faith communities. For now, please pray, but stay tuned for more details and a clearer picture.

# Outreach Ministry

## **HEART (Healing, Equity, & Anti-Racism Team)**

Recognizing that systemic racism and the current incarceration system are intertwined, one of HEART's objectives is to find ways for our parish to serve as a support system for formerly incarcerated people. Our St. Vincent de Paul ministry is already doing some of this work and recently shared a story about support they offered to someone who was formerly incarcerated and had proven to be committed to their education as well as supporting the community since re-entry:

"Although they were living in a transition home, they were experiencing some challenges and were seeking housing in an environment that would be safe and supportive. An apartment became available, but they needed support with move-in costs. Our Vincentians could see how hard this person was working to be the best version of themselves, excelling in their courses and volunteering many hours to give back to the community. So, we teamed up with staff from the community college where our neighbor was enrolled to cover their moving costs and ensure financial stability in the first few months while they continued studying and supporting the community. Our neighbor was incredibly grateful sharing:

*'There are no words that will express the level of gratitude that I have for all of you that has made this possible. It is overwhelming... to have so much support. While I was [in prison]...I never thought that I was going to be worthy of such kindness and compassion. God is continually proving to me the exact opposite through compassionate individuals such as all of you. This opportunity is rife with possibilities for my recovery and personal growth that I am excited for! Thank you and God bless!'*

There are many ways we can provide additional support in giving folks who were formerly incarcerated a second chance to thrive! One of the ways HEART is considering facilitating is the **One Parish, One Prisoner** program (pairing our parish with someone releasing in our area to offer wraparound support, similar to our Immigrant Ministry's work in supporting a family from Afghanistan). As we continue to discern how our parish might offer additional support to formerly incarcerated folks, we ask for your prayers. ## “Praise be to you, my Lord.”

“*LAUDATO SI’, mi’ Signore*” – “*Praise be to you, my Lord.*” These are the words that open Pope Francis’ encyclical on ecology and care for God’s creation. These words, quoting St. Francis of Assisi’s beautiful canticle, remind us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us.

Pope Francis’ encyclical letter *Laudato Si’* was released in June 2015. Five years later, in 2020, Pope Francis invited all Catholics and people of good will to celebrate its fifth anniversary by protecting families and future generations through action to care for our common home. Here are themes that Pope Francis highlighted in *Laudato Si’* which require our urgent response today.

- **A Moral and Spiritual Challenge.** The ecological crisis, Pope Francis writes, is a summons to profound interior conversion—to renew our relationships with God, one another, and the created world.
- **Care for God’s Creation.** God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. Now we have the responsibility to care for and protect it and all people, who are part of creation. Protecting human dignity is strongly linked to care for creation.
- **We are All Connected.** We are connected to the rest of the human family, to the created world, and to those who will come after us in future generations.
- **Impact on the Poor.** People in poverty have contributed least to climate change, yet they are disproportionately impacted by it. As a result of excessive use of natural resource by wealthy nations, those who are poor experience pollution, lack of access to clean water, hunger, and more.
- **Called to Solidarity.** We are one human family and have a shared responsibility for others and for creation. Wealthy countries have a responsibility to reduce consumption of non-renewal resources and should help poorer nations develop in sustainable ways.
- **Technological and economic development** must serve human beings and enhance human dignity, instead of creating an economy of exclusion, so that all people have access to what is needed for authentic human development.
- **Supporting Life, Protecting Creation.** Concern for nature is incompatible with failure to protect vulnerable human beings, such as unborn children, people with disabilities, or victims of human trafficking.
- **A Time to Act.** Pope Francis calls for a change in lifestyle and consumption. We can make important changes as individuals, families, and communities, and as civil and political leaders.
- **Hope and Joy.** “Injustice is not invincible” (no. 74) and we act knowing that we seek to live out God’s vision of renewed relationships with God, ourselves, one another, and creation.
