




Pastor's Page



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Solemnity of **Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe** falls this year on Sunday, November 20th, and marks the final Sunday of the current Liturgical Year. November 27th, the Sunday following Christ the King, marks the start of the **Advent Season** and the beginning of the new Liturgical Year. Between these two Sundays, we celebrate the national holiday of **Thanksgiving Day**. This is our nation's annual occasion for remembering and celebrating all the many reasons we have to be grateful for the abundant blessings we know as American citizens and as brothers and sisters in the human family.

Just as we do each year with the approach of New Year's Day, January 1st, when we make New Year's resolutions, so too we can make resolutions regarding the new Liturgical Year. For example, I can resolve to get to Mass a little earlier so that I can spend some time in prayer before the liturgy begins; I can pledge to prepare better for Mass by prayerfully reading the Scripture texts from the Lectionary for each Sunday; I can strive more diligently to participate fully, consciously, and actively in the Mass, and so fulfill something that is both a right and duty of mine by virtue of my Baptism. Just as with any other activity or sphere of my life, if I try, if I make a sincere effort, I can learn and grow and do better.

Thanksgiving Day falls this year on Thursday, November 24th. As has been the custom here at OLG, a special Thanksgiving Day Mass will be celebrated at 10:00 a.m. in our church. This will be an opportunity for us to gather and to honor Thanksgiving in that "Eucharistic" manner that embodies our highest Catholic expression of thanks and praise to God for all that we have received through Jesus, our Savior. In this sense, every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation is for us Catholics a "Thanksgiving Day."

I hope you will join us for this celebration of the Eucharist and bring with you some item you plan to serve for your own Thanksgiving dinner, as well as something to give to our St. Vincent de Paul Pantry at OLG so that we can share it with those in need whom we strive also to remember and assist in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

If you plan to travel somewhere for the Thanksgiving holiday, please journey in safety, both there and back. May God overshadow you with the protection and companionship of his Holy Spirit, and bring you joy and peace in the fellowship and company of family members and friends.

Are You Interested In Being A Eucharistic Minister?

However, due to the pastoral needs of providing communion to all the faithful, the Church authorizes lay ministers to distribute communion at Mass and to persons who are sick and/or homebound. Eucharistic Ministers must also be fully initiated into the Church, having celebrated baptism, confirmation and First Communion. ***In addition, beginning in January we will return to offering communion by the cup, so we need more EM's to serve at Mass.*** Training will be offered in the coming weeks. Good News!

The Washington State Catholic Conference released a statement that calls for policy makers to develop and implement a holistic plan to care for creation and the common good in the Lower Snake River region. The decline of salmon in the Lower Snake River points to the need to care for our common home. The bishops acknowledge that the diminishing salmon population in the Lower Snake River and the loss of their original habitat pose a threat to the spiritual lifeways of the Original People of the Northwest. The bishops state that the Original Peoples of Washington state should be "principal dialogue partners" in forming a comprehensive plan for the Lower Snake River region. This plan should serve the common good, care for creation, and take into account the treaties and rights of the Original Peoples of Washington state and those who live and work in the Lower Snake River region.
