## ***A Message From Pope Francis***

Pope Francis has released his message for the World Day of Peace, to be celebrated on January 1, 2023, stressing that all crises are interconnected, and we must not forget any of them, but work for the good of humanity. "When tragic events seem to overwhelm our lives, we are called to keep our hearts open to hope and to trust in God, who makes himself present, accompanies us with tenderness, sustains us in our weariness and, above all, guides our path."

There is light even in the darkest hour, says Pope Francis. Using the pandemic as an example: "The pandemic seems to have upset even the most peaceful parts of our world and exposed any number of forms of fragility." Three years later, he stresses, "the time is right to question, learn, grow and allow ourselves to be transformed as individuals and as communities" reminding us, as he has done before, that "we never emerge the same from times of crisis: we emerge either better or worse."

Pope Francis goes on to stress that this is not the post-Covid era we had hoped for or expected. "At the very moment when we dared to hope that the darkest hours of the Covid-19 pandemic were over, a terrible new disaster befell humanity," he said, noting that the world witnessed the onslaught of another scourge: another war, "driven by culpable human decisions."


Pope Francis notes that the war in Ukraine is "reaping innocent victims and spreading insecurity, not only among those directly affected, but in a widespread and indiscriminate way for everyone, also for those who, even thousands of kilometers away, suffer its collateral effects - we need but think of grain shortages and fuel prices." "This war," he says, "together with all the other conflicts around the globe, represents a setback for the whole of humanity and not merely for the parties directly involved. While a vaccine has been found for Covid-19, suitable solutions have not yet been found for the war."

"What then is being asked of us?" the Pope asks, considering all these difficult times: "First of all, to let our hearts be changed by our experience of the crisis." In fact, he explains: "we can no longer think exclusively of carving out space for our personal or national interests, (...) instead we must think in terms of the common good." We cannot, however, ignore one fundamental fact, he continues: "Many moral, social, political and economic crises we are experiencing are all interconnected, and what we see as isolated problems are actually causes and effects of one another."

And he calls on all those in positions of responsibility and on all men and women of goodwill "to revisit the issue of ensuring public health for all"; to "promote actions that enhance peace and put an end to the conflicts and wars that continue to spawn poverty and death"; "to join in caring for our common home and in implementing clear and effective measures to combat climate change"; "to battle the virus of inequality and to ensure food and dignified labor for all, supporting those who lack even a minimum wage and find themselves in great difficulty... The scandal of entire peoples starving remains an open wound."

Finally, Pope Francis asks that in the coming New Year that "we journey together, valuing the lessons that history has to teach us." "To all [people] of goodwill, I express my prayerful trust that, as artisans of peace, they may work, day by day, to make this a good year!"

# *A Letter From Fr. Kevin*



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The rhythm, pace and focus of Christmas that the Church observes and celebrates is in a variety of ways significantly different from the way our secular culture observes and celebrates this period of the year.

For the secular culture, ‘Christmas time’—or the ‘holiday season’ as many secularists now call it—began way back after Thanksgiving as Christmas carols began to be broadcast over the radio stations and Christmas decorations and advertisements began to appear in the stores. In the Church’s tradition and mode of observance, the Christmas season did not begin until the Advent season had ended, and until our liturgical celebration of the Mass of Christmas Eve (December 24<sup>th</sup>) had arrived. This season of Christmas does not end until our celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls this year on January 9<sup>th</sup>.

For the great Sacred Tradition of Catholicism, one that is shared by many other Christian branches as well, Christmas is a season through which God’s people reflect upon the mystery of the Incarnation—God’s Word Made Flesh—as it unfolds in a series of events and aspects which progressively unpack its significance for us: The Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Feast of the Holy Family, the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, the Feast of the Epiphany, and the Baptism of the Lord.

In the secular culture, Christmas ends on December 26<sup>th</sup>, as the post-Christmas sales begin, and as the Christmas carols fade and the decorations begin to come down. For us as Catholics, Christmas has just begun, and it continues to be honored, celebrated, and observed in the Church for at least until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord—though well beyond that in our hearts, I pray. Let each of us remember that the truest measure of the observance of any liturgical celebration or season is the extent to which the mystery being celebrated leads one to live a more Christ-like life. May all our families, and the human family as well, have a truly blessed Christmas (season) and a New Year filled with new hope and holy purpose.

## Pondering


*This Week's Readings at Mass*

- ▶ Luke 2:16-21 • The Shepherds' Visit, the Circumcision

The mysterious and miraculous happenings didn't end for Mary when Jesus was born. As she soon discovered, the announcement of the angel Gabriel was only the beginning of a roller coaster nine-month pregnancy and beyond. Perhaps she and Joseph were just starting to settle down and get some sleep with their newborn when the shepherds arrived with their tale of the angels they had seen.

Unlike the learned and foreign magi who showed up with expensive gifts from far away for the baby Jesus, the shepherds were local. They were poor folks doing their nighttime work in the region when they were honored with receiving the angel's news about the Savior's birth. When they located the baby and his parents, it was in a humble abode that they would have been accustomed to: a barn or a cave where animals were kept. The baby was wrapped in "swaddling clothes," the equivalent of bands of cloth that happened to be on hand, perhaps as the shepherds' children were sometimes dressed.

Upon arrival, the shepherds gushed about the baby and who he was. What they heard from the angel and repeated to Mary and Joseph echoed what Mary had heard from the angel Gabriel—that her baby was destined to be the Messiah, the one chosen to save his people. Mary, we are told, "treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart." Of course, she couldn't fully understand with her rational mind what it all meant and how Jesus would grow into his identity, but we get the sense that she marveled in awe that she got to play a part in the mystery.


