

Dear Friends in Christ,


With the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord falling this year on Monday, January 9th, today's celebration of the Epiphany of the Lord will mark the final Sunday of the Christmas season for us in 2023, and this coming Tuesday, January 10th, will begin the period of Ordinary Time.

As the Christmas season draws to a close, we offer our sincere gratitude to the many individuals and groups who made our Christmas season so beautiful and prayerful, especially in connection with our celebrations of the Masses for the Nativity of the Lord on Christmas Eve/Day, the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God on New Year's Day, and today's Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. This gospel is 28 chapters in length. If one were to read a chapter a day, one could get through the entire gospel in less than a month, and well before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd. As the winter portion of Ordinary Time unfolds, let us seek the help of Saint Matthew in getting to know our Lord Jesus Christ, the one who is Emmanuel, "God is with us," the Son of the Living God.

Suspending The Chalice

We recently received this directive from the Archdiocese: "Throughout history, the Catholic Church has paused the chalice during significant flu seasons. Given the increase of COVID cases, flu cases and RSV cases in our archdiocese, we encourage parishes to suspend the use of the chalice at this time." We will be following this recommendation until it is safe to bring back the sharing of the cup with the assembly.

It Seemed Irrational

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Isaiah 60:1-6 • Glory of the new Zion
- ▶ Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6 • Commission to preach God's plan
- ▶ Matthew 2:1-12 • The visit of the magi

The story of the magi following the star to Bethlehem to find the baby Jesus is one of the most heartwarming parts of the Christmas story. The Greek word for the foreign visitors is best translated "magi" although in popular understanding they are sometimes called the "Three Kings" or the "Three Wise Men." Whoever they were, they are an example to us of great courage and trust. They willingly left their home countries to travel for an unknown distance in search of a newborn child they knew nothing about. They packed expensive gifts (a dangerous/courageous act when traveling overland in those days) and met with the most powerful man in the country, King Herod, on their quest to find the baby.

When they found the baby in an unassuming little town in an ordinary family, their hearts told them they were in the right place and they were overjoyed. The humble surroundings didn't stop them from worshiping the little child and then offering their lavish gifts to him. After that, they dared to listen to their dreams and defy the King, thereby protecting the vulnerable child. Probably none of what they did seemed rational to those around them, but because they followed an inner guidance, we still celebrate their journey today.



A Brief History...

You may remember hearing Joe Cotton in a [November Mass](#) introduce a program [co-founded by the Seattle Archdiocese](#) called One Parish One Prisoner (OPOP). Afterwards, [OLG HEART](#) hosted a Listening Session to assess the level of OLG interest and our community showed strong support for participating in OPOP.

What's happening Now...

In December OLG HEART facilitated key next steps to kick-off OLG participation, including receiving a formal blessing from staff leadership and confirming our Core Team of 7-10 parishioners who journey for 24 months in learning and in relationship-building with our new friend. OLG HEART also received \$4,000 of generous donations towards the \$5,000 needed for one-time Core Team tuition costs. Finally, the One Parish One Prisoner team is actively looking to pair OLG with our new friend.

What's coming up...

In January OLG HEART will host an orientation, where the Core Team will receive their first training and write their first pen pal letter. Our parish community will be looped in increasingly throughout our journey.

It is a re-entry model that matches parishes with an incarcerated person for their mutual transformation. A relationship of trust is built through writing and prison visits. And when the time comes, the person will find the embrace of an entire parish community who already knows them and can assist with the many obstacles to re-entry.

One Parish One Prisoner equips parishes with orientations, online learning modules, ongoing consultation, meeting structures, [resources](#) and materials.
