A Letter From Fr. Kevin



Brothers and sisters in Christ,

With a mere two weeks left in our Lenten pilgrimage of spirit, I wanted to share with you all something that has long been a meaningful—though challenging—piece of my own annual Lenten journey. Ever since I first discovered this reflection, I have viewed it as a sign from God indicating—at least in part—what he wanted me to work on, to strive for and to pray about as I make my way through Lent each year. As we all draw near to the closing stages of this year's Lenten journey, it is not too late to jumpstart the fasting Lent summons us to undertake. This reflection offers food for thought about how one might practice fasting, even if only for the final two weeks of the season.

Fast from worry, and feast on divine order by trusting in God.

Fast from complaining, and feast on appreciation.

Fast from negativity, and feast on affirmation.

Fast from unrelenting pressures, and feast on unceasing prayer.

Fast from hostility, and feast on non-resistance.

Fast from bitterness and resentment, and feast on mercy and forgiveness.

Fast from self-concern, and feast on compassion for others.

Fast from the shadows of sorrow, and feast on the sunlight of serenity.

Fast from idle gossip, and feast on purposeful silence.

Fast from judging others, and feast on God's presence within them.

Fast from emphasis on differences, and feast on the unity of all life.

Fast from apparent darkness, and feast on the reality of light.

Fast from thoughts of illness, and feast on the healing power of God.

Fast from words that pollute, and feast on phrases that purify.

Fast from discontent, and feast on gratitude.

Fast from anger, and feast on tranquility.

Fast from anxiety, and feast on confidence.

Fast from discouragement, and feast on hope.

Fast from facts that depress, and feast on truths that uplift.

Fast from lethargy, and feast on enthusiasm.

Fast from suspicion, and feast on trust.

Fast from thoughts that weaken, and feast on promises that fortify.

Fast from worries that overwhelm, and feast on prayer that undergirds.

May our Lenten fast bring us to the Paschal Feast of Easter enlivened in spirit and renewed in joy.

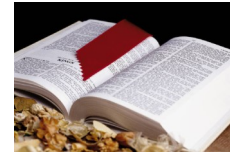

Journey Of The Elect

This week we celebrate the third and final Scrutiny with the Gospel story of the raising of Lazarus. Death is our greatest fear and this story reminds us that God's power and mercy are greater than ANY fear, sin or pain that we have in our lives. Sharon, our Elect, is asked to think about what needs to die in her life in order for her to receive the new life being offered to her in baptism. For some, the question of whether they even want to come out of the tomb is important, whether they are willing to risk coming out into the light of Christ to see what awaits them. She has also been presented with The Lord's Prayer, which teaches us that God loves as a loving father and will "give us ...our daily bread" and "lead us from temptation." As Sharon and Jessica (our candidate for Full Communion) approach these last days of preparation before the Easter sacraments, keep them in your prayers.

Mysteries

This Week's Readings at Mass

- Ezekiel 37:12-14 • Promise of resurrection
- Romans 8:8-11 • The flesh and the Spirit
- John 11:1-45 • The raising of Lazarus

The first reading from Ezekiel is perfectly paired with the Gospel reading of the raising of Lazarus. Ezekiel hears God say very clearly that God will raise his people from the dead, animating them with the spirit that will bring them back to life. The second reading from St. Paul also addresses the Jewish and Christian theological question, "Is death the end of everything?" Paul is as emphatic as Ezekiel. No. "The One who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also."

Of course, it might seem easy to believe in life after death until we have had a loved one die. Martha and Mary might have believed in an afterlife because, as Jews, they would have been familiar with the promise from Ezekiel. Yet when their brother died and the reality of him being gone for four days sank in, they doubted too. Not only did they doubt, but they grieved deeply, and even got angry at Jesus. Martha told Jesus she believes Lazarus "will rise, in the resurrection on the last day," but believing that didn't lessen her other perfectly normal human emotions.

Even after Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, mysteries remain. Why didn't Jesus go to Lazarus immediately when the sisters summoned him? Why did he let them experience heart-breaking sadness for four days? Why did Jesus cry if he knew he would raise Lazarus from the dead? Why did Jesus raise Lazarus but not others who died during his lifetime? Why do some people today get to experience healing miracles, but others don't? Why do we have to wait for the resurrection of the dead to see our loved ones again?

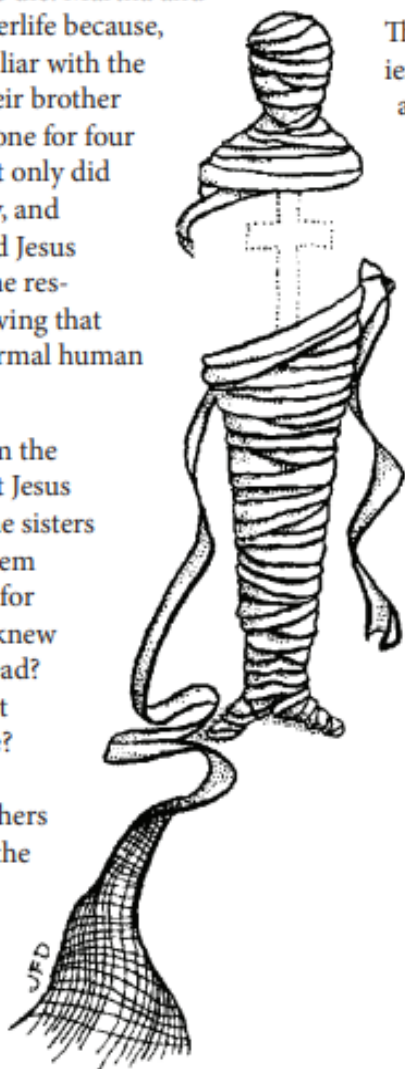
In what ways do I need to strengthen my belief in God's power, particularly in the truth of resurrection?

These readings today don't solve any mysteries of our faith. They don't give us answers about God, but they point to the complete conviction of three different biblical writers who do not doubt that Jesus is "the resurrection and the life."

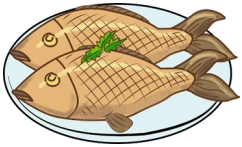

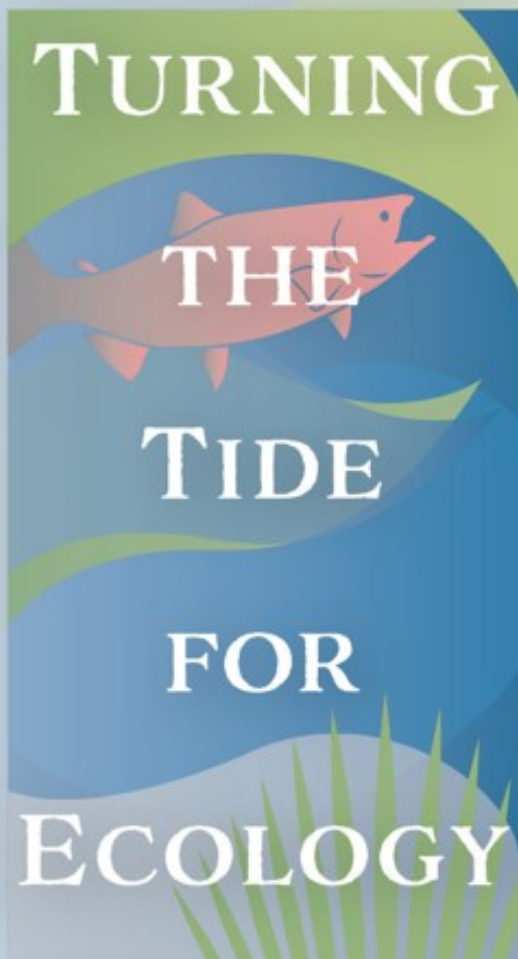
