St. Blaise Throat Blessing


The customary St. Blaise Blessing of Throats will be offered at St. Philip's.

Throat Blessing will be offered after all weekend Masses.




Blessed Palm Drop-Off

The Holy Family of Nazareth

February is the month of the Holy Family. The Holy Family of Nazareth is composed of Jesus Christ, Mary, and St. Joseph.

Jesus Christ: "Only Begotten Son of God... true God from true God... consubstantial with the Father... He came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end" (Nicene Creed).

Mary: Mary is the *Theotokos* (God-Bearer). She is the Mother of God, the Mother of all Christians and the Queen of Heaven. She was conceived without original sin. From a very young age, Mary was dedicated, body and soul, to God. When the time came, she returned home and was betrothed to Joseph. The angel of the Lord appeared to her and announced that she would become the Mother of God. She ushered Christ's first miracle at the wedding feast of Cana, became our mother at the foot of the Cross, and was present at the birth of the Church. She was assumed into heaven and crowned queen of all angels and saints.

St. Joseph: St. Joseph is the foster-father of Jesus and the husband of Mary. He is known as the Savior of the Savior, because he protected the Holy Family from Herod, the world, and all its dangers. He comes from the line of David, and he is known as a just man, who is given the task of teaching the Son of God how to be a man. St. Joseph's life was one of love, devotion and obedience, second only to the Virgin Mary. He is known as the Terror of Demons, the Protector of the Church, and the Patron Saint of a Happy Death.

A Prayer to the Holy Family for Assistance

Lord Jesus Christ, who, being made subject to Mary and Joseph, didst consecrate domestic life by Thine ineffable virtues; grant that we, with the assistance of both, may be taught by the example of Thy Holy Family and may attain to its everlasting fellowship. Who livest and reignest, world without end. Amen.






