





Remembering Vocations in Your Lenten Devotions


Meditation:







Homelessness is real

While homelessness may not seem like a problem in our community, with issues like inflation, increased eviction rates, and overall high cost of living, homelessness is actually a sad reality for our neighbors.

In 2021, nearly 18,000 households in Lewisville lived just above the poverty line but below the cost of living. These households were one crisis, one missed paycheck, or one medical issue away from homelessness.

Month of March: Saint Joseph

Patron of the Church with a Father's Heart

On the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis issued *Patris Corde* (*With a Father's Heart,* December 8, 2020), noting 7 ways "Each of us can discover in Joseph - the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence - an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. St. Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

- A beloved father As spouse of Mary and the father of Jesus, Joseph "placed himself, in the words of St. John Chrysostom, 'at the service of the entire plan of salvation'."
- A tender & loving father "Joseph saw Jesus grow daily 'in wisdom and in years and in divine and human favour' (*Lk* 2:52). As the Lord had done with Israel, so Joseph did with Jesus: he taught him to walk, taking him by the hand; he was for him like a father who raises an infant to his cheeks, bending down to him and feeding him (cf. *Hos* 11:3-4). In Joseph, Jesus saw the tender love of God: 'As a father has compassion for his children, so the Lord has compassion for those who fear him' (*Ps* 103:13)
- **An obedient father** "As He had done with Mary, God revealed His saving plan to Joseph... In every situation, Joseph declared his own 'fiat', like those of Mary at the Annunciation and Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane."
- An accepting father "Often in life, things happen whose meaning we do not understand. Our first reaction is frequently one of disappointment and rebellion. Joseph set aside his own ideas in order to accept the course of events and, mysterious as they seemed, to embrace them, take responsibility for them and make them part of his own history."
- A creatively courageous father "God acted by trusting in Joseph's creative courage. Arriving in Bethlehem and finding no lodging where Mary could give birth, Joseph took a stable and, as best he could, turned it into a welcoming home for the Son of God come into the world. Faced with imminent danger from Herod, who wanted to kill the child, Joseph.. rose in the middle of the night to prepare the flight into Egypt."
- A working father "Work is a means of participating in the work of salvation, an opportunity to hasten the coming of the Kingdom, to develop our talents and abilities, and to put them at the service of society and fraternal communion." "From [Joseph], Jesus learned the value, the dignity and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labour."
- A father in the shadows "The logic of love is always the logic of freedom, and Joseph knew how to love with extraordinary freedom. He never made himself the centre of things. He did not think of himself, but focused instead on the lives of Mary and Jesus."
