### **Beginning the Rosary**

If you are just beginning the habit of praying the Rosary, start small and develop ways to incorporate it into your life—especially life with kids! Try praying the Rosary in the car, or just praying a decade at a time through the day in those moments when you might normally reach for your phone.

Our lives never really stop, and forming any good habit ultimately means making a place for it, sometimes to the point of setting aside some other activity or pleasure. Like an exercise habit, the first few times might not "feel" like you're getting anywhere, but persevere! Don't be afraid to start over and keep trying. There are so many graces and benefits available to those who pray the Rosary:

"Just as two friends, frequently in each other's company, tend to develop similar habits, so too, by holding familiar converse with Jesus and the Blessed Virgin, by meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary and by living the same life in Holy Communion, we can become, to the extent of our lowliness, similar to them and can learn from these supreme models a life of humility, poverty, hiddenness, patience and perfection." - Bl. Bartolo Longo

#### **GROWING IN GRACE**

#### Month of May: The Blessed Virgin Mary

#### A Boy After Mary's Heart

Raymond Kolbe was born January 8, 1894, in Poland, to a very poor, but devout Catholic family. He was no different from any other boy. He spent lots of time getting in and out of trouble, something which worried his mother very much. When he was very young, the Blessed Mother appeared to Kolbe and offered him two crowns: the white crown of chastity or the red crown of martyrdom. She asked him to choose one; Kolbe chose both and his life was forever changed.

#### Mary, Our Little Mother

How did this poor farm boy and trouble maker become one of the most well-known and beloved saints of our time? The answer is simple: he dedicated his whole life and his life work to our Blessed Mother. Our Lady in turn did for him what she does best for her children: She turns them into little Christs. Raymond entered the Conventual Franciscans and became a priest, taking the name Maximilian Maria. He was known by all the other friars for his zeal and his love of the Mother of God. Everything he did was for Mary and with the help of Mary. He often referred to her as his 'little Mother' and he encouraged his fellow friars to join his Militia Immaculata (an army dedicated to bringing the greatest glory to God under the patronage of Mary). He also founded Niepokalanow (City of the Immaculate Mother of God), the largest Franciscan monastery in Poland. During World War II, Fr. Kolbe was arrested by the Nazis and sent to Auschwitz. There he ended up in a starvation bunker after volunteering to take the place of a fellow prisoner who was chosen to die because one of the prisoners had escaped. "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). On August 14, 1941, Maximilian Maria Kolbe died a martyr. He was killed by lethal injection after two weeks of not only surviving, but thriving, in his cell. There, he encouraged his fellow prisoners by leading them in prayer to God and his beloved Immaculata. In 1982 Pope John Paul II declared him a saint. St. Maximilian Kolbe, pray for us!!

#### Act of Consecration to Mary by St. Maximilian Kolbe

O Immaculata, Queen of Heaven and earth, refuge of sinners and our most loving Mother, God has willed to entrust the entire order of mercy to you. I, (name), a repentant sinner, cast myself at your feet humbly imploring you to take me with all that I am and have, wholly to yourself as your possession and property. Please make of me, of all my powers of soul and body, of my whole life, death and eternity, whatever most pleases you. If it pleases you, use all that I am and have without reserve, wholly to accomplish what was said of you: "She will crush your head," and, "You alone have destroyed all heresies in the world." Let me be a fit instrument in your immaculate and merciful hands for introducing and increasing your glory to the maximum in all the many strayed and indifferent souls, and thus help extend as far as possible the blessed kingdom of the most Sacred Heart of Jesus. For wherever you enter, you obtain the grace of conversion and growth in holiness, since it is through your hands that all graces come to us from the most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Amen.




