

A New Direction for Social Outreach Efforts at St. Philip

In her time at St. Philip's, Patricia has truly developed this part of our parish mission, not only in the expansion of our outreach services and programs, but also by her gift for inspiring the generous response of parish volunteers to meet these needs. In addition, Patricia has played a leadership role in our Forward in Faith Capital Campaign, which has already set records for fundraising in our parish. Although Patricia will be greatly missed as an employee at St. Philip, she continues to be a part of our parish family and volunteer team. 



In September of 2019, Matt Gill, St. Philip's Director of Formation and Evangelization, had a great idea: Invite all men of the parish to casually gather at a local watering hole, to share drinks (alcohol or non-alcohol), food, fraternity, and fun. Five years later, the monthly Cold Beverage Night has become a mainstay, a thriving ministry for men of the parish. One of the group's leaders, Matt Walker, shares: "We gather for fellowship, and to get to know other men of our parish. Men from all age groups, from mid-twenties to their eighties, gather and socialize and enjoy a cold beverage."

The first several CBN meetings were held at the little bar in Market Street, in Flower Mound, attracting around half a dozen men each month, including our own Father McDaniel. Sadly, after only a few months, COVID shut down face-to-face meetings. Not wanting to lose momentum, the group decided to hold virtual meetings while everyone was locked down. They enjoyed similar attendance during the virtual meetings, including welcome visits from Father Allan Hawkins.

Once COVID lockdowns faded into distant memory, the CBN crew resumed their in-person meetings. The reinvigorated Cold Beverage Night crowd began rotating between several local spots, including Local Pint, Brass Tap, and Guitars and Growlers. These days, they also branch out to visit other spots in nearby communities, like Denton County Brewing and 3 Nations Brewing.

Since its humble beginnings, attendance has flourished at Cold Beverage Night. The vibrant troop now regularly sees 15-20 men each month. Operating as a true parish ministry, attendees relax with cold beverages, sipping and noshing as they catch up, share joys and sorrows, and offer fraternal love to one another. Adds Matt: "Men have developed connections and friendships that have grown outside of the meet ups, including someone finding a new employment arrangement through the group!"


