### Sunday, June 2 **After 5 PM Sunday Mass**

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ) is the special feast honoring the Blessed Sacrament, the Living Presence of Jesus Christ in our world. We celebrate this feast with a public procession, carrying the Blessed Sacrament out of the church and through our



parking lot. Our procession will conclude back in the church with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

"Corpus Christi is... a renewal of the mystery of Holy Thursday, as it were, in obedience to Jesus' invitation to proclaim from 'the housetops' what he told us in secret (cf. Mt 10: 27). It was the Apostles who received the gift of the Eucharist from the Lord in the intimacy of the Last Supper, but it was destined for all, for the whole world. This is why it should be proclaimed and exposed to view: so that each one may encounter 'Jesus who passes' as happened on the roads of Galilee, Samaria and Judea..."



# **GROWING IN GRACE**

### MONTH OF JUNE: THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Jesus' Heart with which He loved us, later pierced at His crucifixion, and from which flowed His Blood and Water, is the fount of Love and Mercy which we now receive in the sacraments. The very source and summit of our Christian life is the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus.

### A Miracle

In 8th century Lanciano, Italy, a miracle took place which illustrates His Heart for us, literally. There lived a monk who had been experiencing doubts as to Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist. We know that the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Christ, but normally the consecrated elements continue to have the characteristics (or "accidents") of bread and wine. As this monk was celebrating Holy Mass, however, the host was changed into live, physical Flesh and the wine was changed into live Blood.

In our own day, this most wondrous Eucharistic Miracle was analyzed with precision by the finest scientists who found the following to be true: The Flesh is real Flesh. The Blood is real Blood. The Flesh and Blood belong to the human species. The Flesh is a Heart, complete in its essential structure.

There, hidden to the eye and fully present in the Eucharist, resides Jesus: the whole Christ with His human heart. When we receive HIM, we receive His Heart. His infinite Love is living in our midst in the Blessed Sacrament. But this is only the beginning. We must do our part. We must return our love to Him.

### Jesus speaks to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque

With tremendous sadness, Jesus tells St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a 17th century nun, "behold this Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to consuming itself to witness its love. And in return, I receive from most of them only ingratitude from their irreverence and their sacrileges and by the coldness and contempt that they have for Me in this sacrament of love."

### The Sacrifice

In "The Sacred Heart Is the Holy Eucharist", Father John Hardon suggests that the best way for us to practice devotion to the Sacred Heart is "by totally and constantly conforming, submitting and surrendering our lives to Him. This is THE sacrifice God wants of us during our lives – allowing Him to move our wills... we must give up our wills completely and unconditionally. In everything we do we must say, 'Lord, I will do what You want me to do'. Every moment of our lives is a providential expression of God's love for us, inviting us to respond no matter what the cost is to ourselves". He will give us the strength to do just that if we stay bound to His Heart. God has written in our hearts this great desire for His Heart and He doesn't leave us alone. Jesus, God made man, invites us to find Him, small and hidden, in the Eucharist.

If we want to remain close to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we must remain close to the Eucharist.

### **PRAYER**

O most Holy Heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore You, I love You and with lively sorrow for my sins, I offer You this poor heart of mine. Make me humble, patient, pure and wholly obedient to your will. Grant, good Jesus, that I may live in You and for You. Amen

### **INSPIRATION**

"I want you to be very little, because when you are little, I carry you close to my heart." – Jesus to St. Faustina

"Jesus knew and loved us each and all during His life, His agony and His Passion and gave Himself up for each one of us...He has loved us all with a human heart." – Catechism of the Catholic Church, para. 478

### How to Love Jesus More...

So, we must go to Him, often, and with a heart to adore Him, console Him and make reparation to Him. We can do this by making Holy Hours of Adoration and practicing the devotion of receiving Holy Communion on the first Friday of each month. We can cheer Him with our trust and constant thanks and praise.



# Be a Mentor for High Schoolers


### **Discipleship Group Mentors needed!**

# June Neighbor Days: Christian Community Action





No: The sacrament of Anointing is for anyone suffering from a grave illness, experiencing frailty due to old age, or about to undergo surgery. If you are facing any of these conditions, don't be afraid to receive Anointing of the Sick. You can also receive the sacrament of Anointing more than once.
