



NEXT STEPS FORWARD

Building Plans Reach New Milestone

This summer, the plans for our new parish life center and parking expansion reach a new milestone as they go to the Town of Flower Mound for approval. This approval is a three-step process:

1. Environmental Conservation Commission

Although the designs for the parish campus aim to preserve as much of the natural beauty of our property as possible, some trees will need to be removed to allow the new parish life center to be located conveniently near the church. Our first step is to obtain a tree removal permit from the ECC and to present our plans for planting additional trees (you may have already seen the posted notice signs on the church property).

2. Planning and Zoning

The next step in the approval process is a meeting with the Planning and Zoning Commission, where we will seek approval of our plans relating to town codes and regulations.

3. Town Council

Once we obtain approval from the Planning and Zoning Commission, a last meeting will be scheduled with the Town Council to award the final approval.

When will we break ground on the new parish life center?

Along with the development of our building plans, we continue to raise funds through our *Forward in Faith* Capital Campaign. In addition to finalizing our plans, we will need to reach our Celebration Goal of \$10.8 million to break ground. We are so close!

Celebration Goal \$10.8 million

- Retire \$2.6 million Phase I construction debt DONE!
- Reach \$8.2 million Diocesan funding requirement* to begin construction on the parish life center and parking expansion

Challenge Goal \$15.2 million

 Complete parish life center and expanded parking without taking on additional debt

*The Diocese of Fort Worth requires 65% of the total building project cost (\$12.6 million) to be raised in cash and pledges before beginning construction. The remainder of our project cost can be financed as we continue to raise funds.



Saint Maria Goretti Relic


Saturday, July 6, 9 AM Mass




What are Special Projects and How Do I Sign Up?






Pillars of Stewardship

Parish Hospitality comes in many forms; its basis is creating a welcoming environment while fostering a culture of belonging. We achieve this in everything from simple events like coffee and donuts after Mass to larger scale gatherings like the Parish Festival. Hospitality fosters a sense of belonging through participation; it invites parishioners to share ownership in the parish through volunteering and planning.

The mission statement of FRIENDSHIP, FOOD & FUN (FFF) is to the point: FFF is an adult parishioner potluck dinner group organized to meet and greet fellow parishioners. The ministry grew out of the Guess Who's Coming to Dinner ministry that St. Philip's sponsored several years ago. As participation in that group, which met in member's homes, had dwindled, "several of us decided to revise it and start having the dinners at church," says ministry co-chair Deb Putman.

There is no cost to attend FFF dinners. Participants are simply asked to bring a dish to share -- appetizer, entrée, or dessert. Over delicious fare, attendees exchange stories and learn about each other. Spouses, as well as adult friends and neighbors, are always welcome.

The FFF leadership team notifies participants about the dinners by email two weeks before the gathering date; announcements are also placed in the parish bulletin. To add fun and flare to the gatherings, the dinners usually have a theme, with the food focused on that theme. Deb adds: "It gives adult participants an opportunity to share a meal with other parishioners; it also provides an opportunity to get out in a comfortable, safe environment."

All FFF dinners are held on Saturdays in St. Joseph Hall, and normally begin around 5:30 PM. Anyone attending the 4 PM Vigil Mass may drop off their dish before Mass. Reservations are required. Once an RSVP is received, a category (e.g., appetizer, entrée, salad, etc.) is assigned. Participants may request a category if that category has not already been covered. Then, everyone gathers and shares! (Diocesan/ parish guidelines are followed regarding the consumption of alcohol.) The ministry even provides to-go boxes.

Participants don't commit to attend every dinner - they may attend at their convenience. Deb encourages parishioners (and their friends) to drop in frequently: One time you may socialize with both old and new friends; the next time around, in addition to seeing familiar faces "you may meet other new friends."


