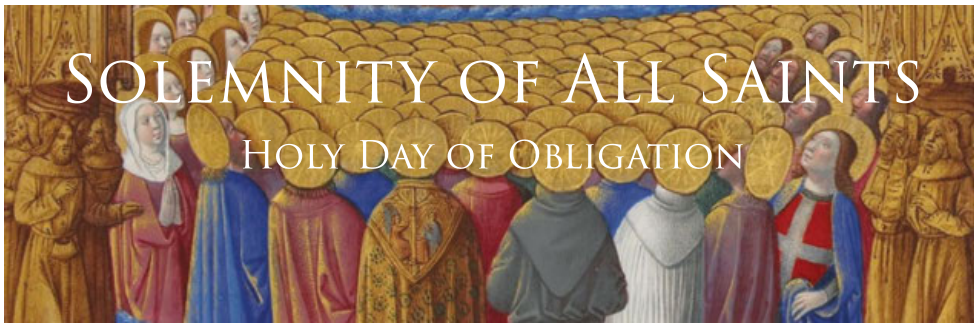

Adoration Chapel

Many parishioners expressed a desire for an Adoration Chapel as part of our next building project, but we were initially unable to include this in plans. After some evaluation, we are pleased to announce that we have found a way to include an Adoration Chapel inside the Parish Hall.

The new Chapel will be located on the second floor of the Parish Hall, immediately adjacent to the elevator and stairs, and convenient to the front doors of the building and parking lot. The area can be easily secured for nighttime Adoration hours, and has restroom facilities nearby. The new Chapel also includes a confessional to provide space for the Sacrament of Reconciliation in our new building. Plans are in progress to make this a quiet and beautiful place for Eucharistic Adoration.

Join us **LIVE** in St. Joseph Hall

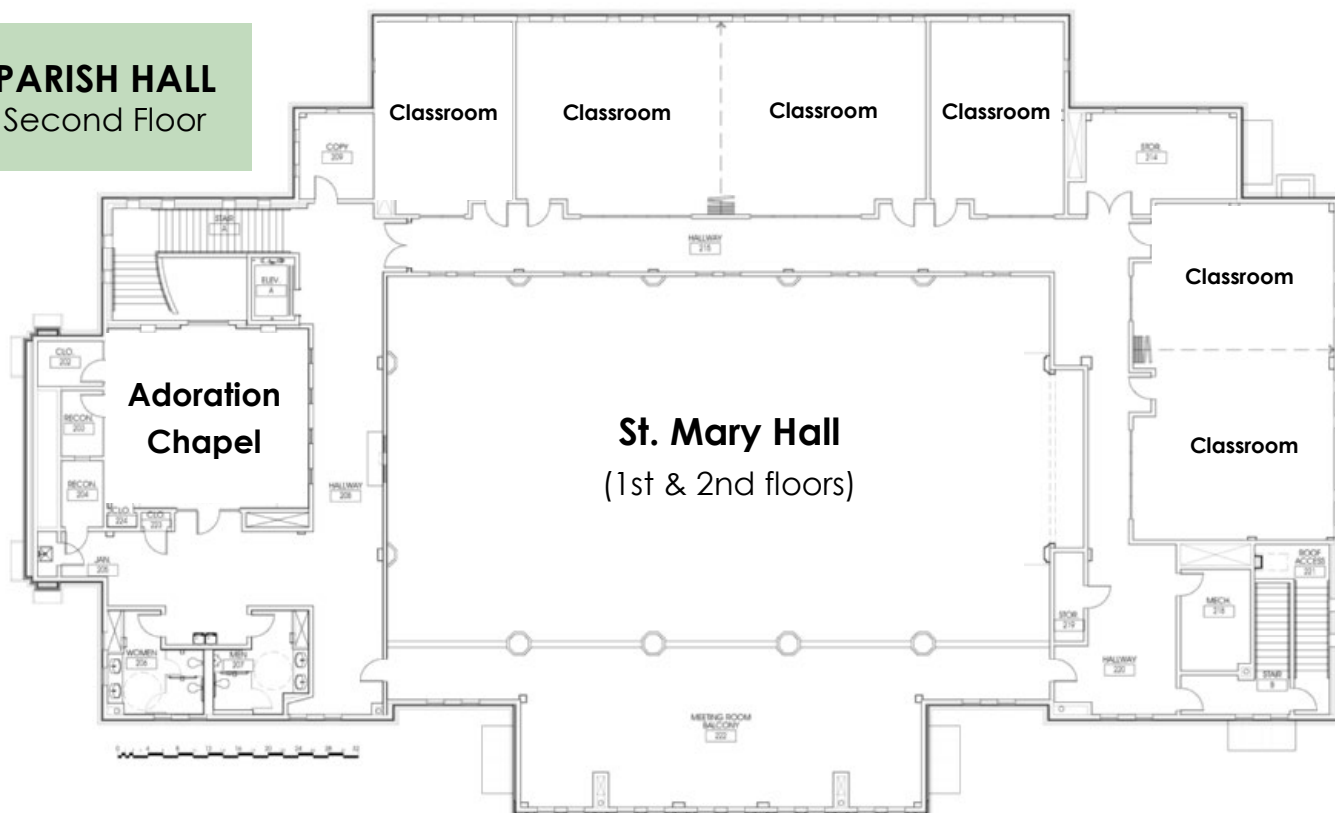

Join an incredible Jubilee Year pilgrimage with Fr. McDaniel: Experience the many sights of the Eternal City, such the four Major Basilicas, the Holy Stairs, the Vatican Museum, the Papal Audience, and much more. What is an Indulgence?

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints...An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin...The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead" (CCC 1471).

How to Gain Indulgences

To gain a **partial indulgence**, one must be a Catholic in a state of grace and perform the act to which the indulgence is attached with a contrite heart. To gain a **plenary (or total) indulgence**:

- Perform the act (such as one of those described here) while in a state of grace and with the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin (even venial sin)
- Make a sacramental Confession
- Receive Holy Communion
- Pray for the Pope's intentions (*one Our Father and one Hail Mary is customary*)

In order to be granted the indulgence, it is permissible to go to Confession and receive Holy Communion within 20 days of the act; however, it is preferred that this be done on the same day as the act. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

All Souls' Day Mass of Remembrance 9 am, November 2

Those attending the Mass of Remembrance are invited to write down the name(s) of deceased loved ones they would like to remember (please arrive 30 minutes early to participate). These names will be read during the Mass. As the names of your loved ones are read, we invite you to take one of the provided candles up to the altar.

Praying for the Holy Souls

"As we enter heaven, we will see them, so many of them, coming towards us and thanking us. We will ask them who they are, and they will say: 'A poor soul you prayed for in purgatory.'"

The month of November is a time when the Church calls us to meditate on the Four Last Things (Death, Judgment, Heaven, Hell), and to pray for the Faithful Departed. We know that the Holy Souls in Purgatory are those who have died "in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, para. 1031), and that our prayers, almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance can help them (cf. CCC, para. 1032)

Special Indulgences in November

From November 1 to November 8, inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to Poor Souls in Purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed, provided the usual conditions are met.

On November 2, All Souls Day, a plenary indulgence for Poor Souls will be granted to those who visit any parish church or public oratory and there recite one Our Father and one Creed.

Plenary indulgences are granted only once each day, and under specific conditions (see left). If these conditions are not met, you can still receive a partial indulgence for performing these good works, which is also of great benefit to the Holy Souls.

Partial indulgences are granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead, and to those who recite the Eternal Rest Prayer below. Partial indulgences may also be granted more than once each day.

*Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord,
and let perpetual light shine upon them.
May they rest in peace. Amen.*

Hundreds of babies and moms are served through the Gabriel Project. As the Angel Gabriel brings good news, donors to the Annual Diocesan Appeal are good news bearers to local new moms in need.
