

What Do Our Goals Mean?

We recently met our \$10.8 million Celebration Goal, which has allowed us to break ground on the Parish Hall, but what does the other goal on the Campaign Thermometer mean?

\$10.8 million

Our Celebration Goal to Break Ground (COMPLETED APRIL 2025!)

- Retire Phase I construction debt
- Reach Diocesan funding requirement of 65% of our project cost to break ground on the Parish Hall and parking expansion

\$15.2 million

Our Challenge Goal to Fully Fund Our Project

Raise remaining 35% of our construction costs to complete Parish Hall and expanded parking without taking on additional debt. This will be our next challenge as we move Forward in Faith!

Together, we have come so far already—but we'll keep working as we build! St. Philip's continues fundraising through the Forward in Faith Campaign to ensure our parish takes on as little debt as possible.



Month of May: The Blessed Virgin Mary

Our Blessed Mother, according to the Gospels and Catholic tradition, is often seen as a model of both material and spiritual poverty, showing us that true riches are found in a relationship with God. Her life was completely consecrated to the service of her Son. She saw herself as a lowly handmaid for whom God wrought wonders. She is an example of the "poor in spirit" with us. Our Lady experienced poverty at the birth of Christ when she had to take shelter in a stable, lay her babe in a manger and warmed him in cheap swaddling clothes. (The manger signifies the birth of the Christ Child in the center of every human heart that is poor in spirit.)

It is believed that Mary remained in poverty throughout her life. At the purification in the temple she had only two pigeons or turtle doves, the oblation prescribed for the poor who could not offer a lamb. Mary's detachment from material wealth allowed her to focus on her relationship with God. **Simplicity, humility and a willingness to serve God were deeply ingrained.** Through all her doubts and uncertainties, Mary remained faithful to her Son. Even in difficult circumstances, such as Calvary, these traits were hallmarks of her spiritual poverty. Mary's virtues give hope and encouragement to every Christian; she is the mother of the faithful and *all generations call her blessed*.

Her words in the Magnificat show Mary's preference for the poor and needy, and her longing for justice and righteousness. She reminds us that God favors the weak and lowly over the proud, powerful and rich. The poor are blessed above all because they have room in their lives for the coming of God's Son. Mary's life and teachings are reflected in the Catholic Church's concern for the poor, emphasizing the need to care for the marginalized, suffering and vulnerable.

Saint John Paul II, in his encyclical *Redemptoris Mater*, presents Mary as a model of pilgrim faith, one who "goes before us on the pilgrimage." Her reliance on faith places her among the "anawim," the poor of the Lord. In her detachment from the things of the world and her *fiat*, she is ready to be an instrument of God's will and accept the responsibility to let God's will be done in her. Her poverty is an openness to be filled up by God alone.

Many authors believe that Our Blessed Mother even made a vow of poverty. St. Bridget relates that Our Lady told her: "from the beginning I vowed in my own heart that I would never possess anything on earth."

Through her poverty, we see the joy in possessing God alone as the greatest treasure imaginable. Her Magnificat shows that she loves to be poor and identifies with the poor. **She loves to be poor in order to serve God to the fullest.** In her Magnificat, Mary proclaimed that her joy is in God: "My spirit rejoices in God my Savior."
