

PREPARING FOR CONSTRUCTION

Our project to build a Parish Hall and Parking Expansion is beginning soon!

In the Diocese of Fort Worth, the Sacrament of Confirmation is typically conferred on teens of at least 15 years of age. **Teens can** prepare while 14 years old, as long as they will be 15 at the time of Confirmation. Preparation consists of attending 8 classes, learning certain pious practices, and completing an assessment.




Faith & Reason Adult Book Study

About Padre Pio

One of the most famous and beloved Saints of the past century, Padre Pio was born Francesco Forgione to a devout Italian family of peasant farmers in 1887. By the age of five, little Francesco had already decided to dedicate his life to God, and as a young boy could see his own quardian angel. At the age of 15, entered the Capuchin order, taking the name "Friar Pio." Pio experienced religious ecstasy and other occurrences, including battles with the devil, and he gained a reputation for sanctity. He was ordained a priest in 1910, thus becoming Father Pio or "Padre Pio."

Padre Pio experienced the phenomenon known as the stigmata, unexplained wounds in likeness to those received by Our Lord in the Passion. For fifty years, Padre Pio bore painful, bleeding wounds in his hands, feet, and side.

Padre Pio's advice and counsel was sought by many, and he heard countless confessions. After his death in 1968, Padre Pio's funeral drew over 100,000 mourners. He was canonized in 2002.


