

Pray the Rosary this October

The Rosary is the "Gospel of the hand", where we are invited to fruitfully contemplate the lives of Jesus and Mary in prayer. Incredible graces and blessings flow from this devotion: What if every family at St. Philip's prayed the Rosary, once a day, once a week, or even once a month?

On the weekend of September 27/28, we're inviting every family to join in as we celebrate the month of October, devoted to the Holy Rosary. Pledge to pray a Rosary – the frequency is up to you—and find out how it can bring grace into your life.

Beginning the Rosary

If you are just beginning the habit of praying the Rosary, start small and develop ways to incorporate it into your life—especially life with kids! Try praying the Rosary in the car, or just praying a decade at a time through the day in those moments when you might normally reach for your phone.

Our lives never really stop, and forming any good habit ultimately means making a place for it, sometimes to the point of setting aside some other activity or pleasure. Like an exercise habit, the first few times might not "feel" like you're getting anywhere, but persevere! **Don't be afraid to start over and keep trying.**

Pope Leo speaks about the Rosary:

"First of all, it's very important to go slowly and to find the style of prayer that works for you, we're all different, many spiritualities; for myself, especially praying together with someone, from my own parents, praying the rosary together. My parents prayed the rosary together their whole lives. Every day. And I found that I was always blessed, I'm sure, because of it; their love for one another, they put their faith in God and in the intercession through Mary. It's a wonderful thing."







The majority are from the Chin State and other ethnic communities in Myanmar. St. Philip's own Chin Community was organized in 2015 by Robert Hram Hei. Members gathered in a small apartment for prayer meetings in their native tongue; soon, they established the Texas Chin Catholic Community. After Burmese Bishop Lucius Hre Kung visited them in 2016, they contacted St. Philip parish.

Community member Tha Hnem Sung tells the story: "Deacon Jim Rodgers took very good care of us. He arranged ESL and Citizenship classes for us in 2018. Almost everyone is now a U.S. Citizen, and we've become very active parishioners because of him. The Bishop of Hakha visits us whenever he visits the U.S. There are currently 24 families and 91 people in our community."

Each week, the vibrant Chin Community holds prayer meetings at the Church. When a Chin priest visits the parish, they have Mass and confession in their native language. These faithful parishioners also:

- Hold Rosary prayer meetings once a month
- Sponsor an annual retreat by a Chin priest
- Host annual Sport Day and BBQ fêtes
- Convene a general meeting once a year

Cherishing Our Blessed Mother and St. Philip the Apostle as their patrons, Chin Community members wholly embrace their strong Catholic faith. Tha adds: "The Catholic Church is where we feel at home. We are always grateful for our blessings—we are taken good care of by Fr. McDaniel and all the staff of St. Philip."


