The AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military, and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment.



What is the 40 Hours Devotion?

The 40 Hours Devotion is 40 hours of continuous Eucharistic Adoration offered in a parish. It's important to note here that the hours are shared by the community - the devotion does not mean an individual spends 40 hours in the church! The devotion may have originated in medieval practices of Eucharistic Adoration during Holy Week, commemorating the 40 hours between Jesus' burial and resurrection. In the 16th century, the 40 Hours Devotion became more formally instituted, helping to reawaken Eucharistic devotion in the faithful following the challenge of the Protestant Reformation. In our current day, it is an opportunity to renew and deepen our love for Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Like Mary, the sister of Martha, we take a little time to sit at the feet of Jesus and focus on the one thing necessary: our relationship with God.






