The word "us" refers to the person reciting the chaplet and those for whom he desires to offer it or for whom he should pray. The "whole world" indicates all people living on earth and the souls in Purgatory. By praying the words of this chaplet, we are performing an act of love towards our neighbor, which along with trust, is the indispensable condition for obtaining graces. 
