

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

During this month dedicated to the Holy Souls, we continue to pray for all the faithful departed. I hope you will take time throughout November to offer a rosary, visit a cemetery, or offer a Mass for your deceased loved ones. Because many times we commemorate the Feast of All Souls on November 2 and then quickly set aside our awareness of these souls' reliance on our continued prayers and sacrifices on their behalf, which are powerful means to help them on their way to Heaven.

Why do we pray for the deceased? It comes down to our Catholic belief in Purgatory, a place where souls go that died in the state of grace, but still with some imperfections on their soul. In Purgatory they are purified by God's grace so as to be ready to enter into the fullness of Heaven. If we didn't believe in Purgatory, it wouldn't make sense to offer prayers and Masses for the dead, as it wouldn't help them at all, and our loved one's Funeral Mass would be nothing more than a time of remembrance. But Purgatory being a tenet of our Catholic faith, we believe our prayers and sacrifices are effective in helping them. The Old Testament book of 2 Maccabees is one of the earliest Scriptural references to praying for the dead: "In praying for the dead [Judas Maccabeus] acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection of the dead in view; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from this sin" (2 Maccabees 12:43b-46).

The Catholic teaching on Purgatory is one that many people are uncomfortable with. To think that our loved ones may not already be in Heaven leaves us saddened, because we want nothing more for them than their eternal rest, hoping that they are waiting with eager expectation to welcome us into the Kingdom one day. However, I have come to understand our Church's teaching on Purgatory as a joyful reminder of how God wants us to reap the fullest experience of eternity with Him. By purifying us in Purgatory of the imperfections that would keep God from entering into every corner of our heart, God makes us ready to experience the fullness of Heaven. We live this life imperfectly, with doubts, fears and inhibitions that keep us from experiencing God fully. But these are purified in Purgatory, leaving us free to enjoy the fullness of God's presence.

This month of the Holy Souls, in addition to being a time to pray for the deceased, is a time for us to pray out of compassion for those who survive their loved ones. My family experienced the loss of two members of our immediate family within fourteen months - my father passed away in December 2011, and my brother passed away in February 2013. These were devastating losses for my family, especially for my mother, who still struggles at times today. It was that first-hand experience with death that made me realize how true it is that a person does not simply "get over" the loss of a loved one in a matter of weeks, months or even years. There will always be a void in their life for not having that person there. They may outwardly seem to function well, they may get stronger over time so they can carry the weight of their sorrow, but the sorrow still remains. Whether it is a recent loss or a loss from years ago, our unity in Christ compels us to comfort the sorrowing, either physically or through our prayer. As St. Paul wrote: "God has constructed the Body [of Christ, so that] if one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it" (1 Corinthians 12:24, 26).

It has been a great comfort to me and my family, in the course of our grieving over the years, to know that we have been supported by the prayers of so many. And in this month of the Holy Souls, it's a great comfort to know that we still have a way to reach out to our dad and brother and assist them with our prayers. It reminds us of the intimate connection that still remains, even though separated by death. And we are confident that our prayers are effective. It takes nothing away from our hope that they are in Heaven – in fact, it reinforces that hope, because we know that God is still actively working in their souls, to bring them to the joys of Heaven.

Baptism Classes




