FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

To Sing or Not to Sing...

Most of us have had the experience of being deeply moved by a beautiful and meaningful song. For example, what immediately comes to my mind is the National Anthem. It's hard to sing our national anthem without being impacted by not only the beauty of the melody but of its great significance for us Americans.

We, in fact, frequently add music to important celebrations/events in our life to help add grandeur and a certain nobility and importance to the event at hand (think for example of birthday celebrations, attending a fancy restaurant with your soon to be fiancé, when we're sitting around the campfire with family and friends—often campfire songs start to organically come out of our mouths and a greater joy is brought forth into the experience, etc.). Yes, music plays many important roles in our life. Therefore, it makes great sense that sacred music has long been considered essential to our time of giving worship to God, the noblest act we engage in as human beings. Sacred music is distinct from all other music because its purpose is directed toward the worship of God. This is achieved both in its unique melodies and lyrics.

Here is some of what the document on the Divine Liturgy from the Second Vatican Council had to say about sacred music: "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art. The main reason for this pre-




eminence is that, as sacred song united to the words, it forms a necessary or integral part of the solemn liturgy" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, par 112). Here is another striking quote from the same document: "Holy Scripture, indeed, has bestowed praise upon sacred song." The document here references the following quote from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians, "...sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts" (Eph 5:19). Finally, the document states that "[r]eligious singing by the people is to be intelligently fostered so that in devotions and sacred exercises, as also during liturgical services, the voices of the faithful may ring out according to the norms and requirements of the rubrics" (par.118).

Clearly, sacred music is critically important whenever we gather for worship, particularly for Sunday (Saturday Vigil Mass, too) Masses since these are to be celebrated with great solemnity/ importance. Moreover, sacred music is not something merely to be listened to at Mass but is a way in which the whole congregation can actively participate in the worship of God.

Let us reconsider the importance of the Holy Mass. The Holy Mass is our participation in the very worship of Jesus Christ given to God the Father. An occasion such as this deserves sacred music which will help lift our hearts and minds and insert us, as it were, more deeply into the reality in which we are participating. I encourage you to join in song at our Holy Masses, pay attention to the words you are singing, and allow yourself to more fully participate in this worship.





In 1977 Melissa Ohden survived a botched abortion at St. Luke's Hospital in Sioux City, Iowa. Melissa was the featured speaker at the "Options for Women" banquet/ fundraiser held in Mankato on Sunday evening at the 'Kato Ballroom. Three of us from the St. Mary/St.Henry Pro-Life Team were among the nearly 500 in attendance who heard firsthand the incredible story of a 44 year-old woman who survived a failed saline infusion abortion at approximately seven months gestation. Hers was a story of the nurses who saved her life, the love and care she received from her adoptive parents and, after many years, the amazing connection she made with her birth parents. With the help of Our LORD, Melissa has forgiven all who were involved with the abortion attempt. Wishing to help others in a similar situation, Melissa is the Founder and Director of "The Abortion Survivors Network", an advocacy and healing organization for abortion survivors.



Currently our pro-life team is sponsoring a drive to collect new Options | MANKATO baby items during this month of October, Respect Life Month.

These items will be donated to "Options for Women", Mankato. This non-profit organization exists to help both women and men in the surrounding area with the assistance, guidance and education they need when facing an unplanned pregnancy.
