### Storms of Life

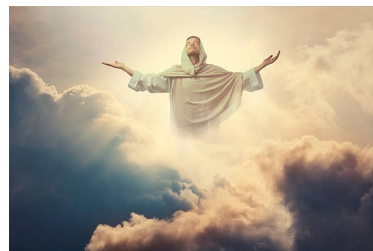

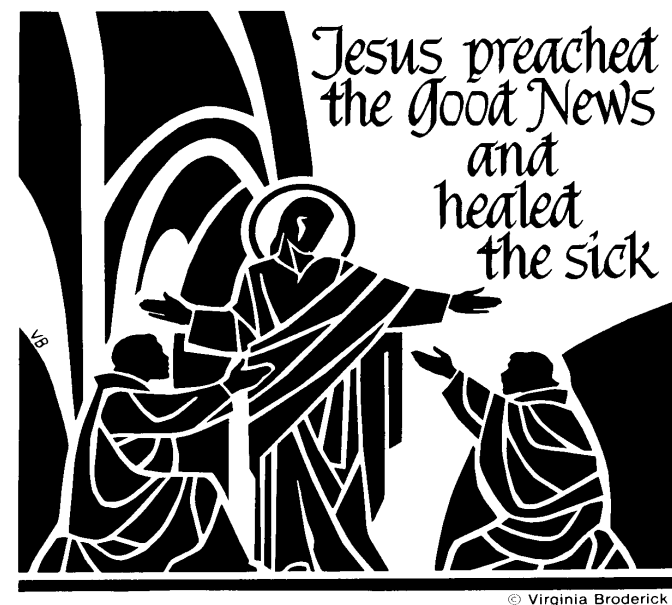

## **Mother Teresa - Feast Day September 5th**

Mother Teresa was a Roman Catholic nun who became well-known around the world for her work as a missionary. She was born Anjezë Gonxhe Bojaxhiu, an Albanian-Indian, on August 26, 1910, in Skopje, in the Ottoman Empire, to Nikollë and Dranfile Bojaxhiu. Her father died when she was eight and by the time she was 12 she had already convinced that she wanted to commit herself to religion. At 18 Teresa left home to join the Sisters of Loreto in Rathfarnham, Ireland, to become a missionary. On May 24<sup>th</sup>, 1931 Teresa took her first religious vows, being named after the patron saint of missionaries - Therese de Lisieux. She took her solemn vows on May 14, 1937. For the next 20 years Teresa served as a teacher at the Loreto convent school. In 1946 Teresa received 'the call' that led her to missionary work.
