St. Martin of Tours- Monday, November 11th
 Today's saint has become a legend. A Hungarian raised in Italy, an unwilling soldier converted to Christ, Martin gave away his cloak and became a monk in Gaul. Later he founded the first monastery in the West. In 372 this rugged, unprepossessing person became bishop of Tours. His great work was to convert the pagan countryside. Then only the cities held Christians. He organized a mission approach, founded more monasteries, in a sense made France Catholic. Martin died in 397.

St. Josaphat - Tuesday, November 12th
 Today's saint is a martyr and patron for reunion of the Greek and Latin Churches. Born in Poland in 1580 as an Orthodox, he became a Catholic and then a monk and priest of the Order of St. Basil. He became an archimandrite and later Archbishop of Poloz. A zealous bishop and worker for Christian unity, in 1623 Josaphat was assassinated by enemies while making a pastoral visitation. He was canonized a saint in 1867.

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini - Wednesday, November 13
 American Catholics have particular devotion to the first canonized United States citizen, to their "Mother Cabrini." Born in north Italy, 1850, she was considered too sickly to join the local religious order. In time she energetically founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, started several houses in Italy and in 1889 came to New York to help Italian immigrants. Before her death from malaria at Chicago in 1917, Mother Cabrini became a naturalized citizen, crossed the Atlantic 30 times, established 67 religious houses with more than 1,500 daughters. Her body is at Mother Cabrini High School in New Your City. She was canonized a saint in 1946.

CATECHISM - The Resurrection

- 988 The Christian Creed - the profession of our faith in God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and in God's creative, saving, and sanctifying action—culminates in the proclamation of the resurrection of the dead on the last day and in life everlasting.
- 989 We firmly believe, and hence we hope that, just as Christ is truly risen from the dead and lives for ever, so after death the righteous will live for ever with the risen Christ and he will raise them up on the last day. Our resurrection, like his own, will be the work of the Most Holy Trinity.
- 990 The term "flesh" refers to man in his state of weakness and mortality. The "resurrection of the flesh" (the literal formulation of the Apostles' Creed) means not only that the immortal soul will live on after death, but that even our "mortal body" will come to life again.
- 991 Belief in the resurrection of the dead has been an essential element of the Christian faith from its beginnings. "The confidence of Christians is the resurrection of the dead; believing this we live."
