In the atrium of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, we present to the children the Land of Israel as the particular place which God favored and chose. He chose this place out of all the countries in the whole world, to be the homeland of Jesus. For the younger children we introduce a globe, a raised surface map of the Holy Land and Jerusalem, and a puzzle of the Holy Land. This allows the children to locate the Land of

Israel and also orient them to Israel in relation to their own home in the United States. The purpose of offering geography for the three to six year old child is (1) to see Jesus as historical, i.e., real person, (2) to see salvation as realized in time and space, and (3) to nourish the child's sense of order, that there is a place for everything. BE THE FACE OF CHRIST AND HIS HELPING HANDS

Dear Parishioners of Saint Denis,

As I sat down to write this short text, my heart immediately flooded with gratitude to every one of you. I don't need to remind you how challenging the last three years have been. Despite all the challenges you have been there for our Saint Denis Parish, not only to survive, but to develop and grow.

We are not out of the woods yet with COVID, and we also understand that this is a challenging year financially for many. Saint Denis Parish is also feeling those same challenges. Let me give you some examples. As of this writing,

Partners in Charity Appeal – we need a total of \$11,720 to reach our parish goal. I truly believe that we will meet that need, but only through your participation. Partners in Charity helps with different ministries that we have in our diocese, for example, the Vocations Office and House of Studies. In addition to it, I am a fruit of Partners in Charity Appeal and like all seminarians and priests from overseas, the Diocese has helped pay for a portion of the overall costs of my immigration attorneys and fees. Please, I ask you prayerfully to make a gift today to support the Annual Appeal and help us to meet our parish goal.

Entrance of Fr. Lacey Hall - The company responsible for the renovation will start the work this month of July 2023. Our project will cost us around \$14.000, and \$4,450 was donated for it. The remaining amount we need to cover this entire project will be taken from our DEF account (Legacy of Hope Campaign). Thank you for your support in assisting with this project.

Two future projects – it is with a broken heart that I inform you that the bathrooms inside of Fr. Lacey Hall and the ramp attached to the building, and one of the two ramps we have attached to our church were condemned by the city after rigorous inspection. The Town Hall requested that all these renovations be done according to the Massachusetts State *Building Code and* this project will cost us about \$60,000.

Dear parishioners, I am giving you all these updates not to discourage you, but to give you an idea of how many things we need to do to keep our parish developing and growing. I came to St Denis Church in January of this 2023 year, and as you may remember, we have done a lot for our parish, such as, a new parish office with all its furniture for free. We are so thankful to Fr Thiago Ibiapina, from Annunciation Parish, who got all the furniture from a Office that got closed in Gardner. Fr. Ibiapina saved us about \$4.000 that includes chairs, desks and cabinets.

Another beautiful response from our parishioners was with the campaign for tables that we use to rent for our festival. Every year, for our festival, we rent tables but from now on, because of your generosity, we don't need to rent tables. Through our *"Tables Campaign"* we got all that we need.

In addition to these updates, another wonderful work done in our parish hall is the shelves that my cousins built in one rooms for our CCD program, and one of the rooms that Knights of Columbus will use to put all the stuff we use for our annual fundraisings dinners and festival. My cousins gave us the labor for free and saved us about \$450.

God is working tremendously in our Parish. Sometimes, people are only paying their attention into small things, but please start paying attention into how big are the problems I need to fix in the next few years with your cooperation. Please don't feel discouraged and don't let small things keep you away from where you were supposed to be. Remember always that WE ARE HERE for this parish.

Some of you may have noticed that the monument dedicated to babies, victims of abortion, which was in front of our Church is no longer there. I'm sorry for any bad feelings caused to you by moving the monument to the cemetery. But I would like you to consider that our Church is a place where all people are welcome, especially those who, one day in a moment of weakness, fall into the temptation of having an abortion. Remember that God is mercy and compassion, and Saint Denis Parish will always be a merciful and compassionate place for people who come here in searching of healing.
