Haitian Refugee - Update: Our first Haitian Welcome Dinner was served on Jan.15th at St. Edward's. More than 25 refugees attended. Our next meal is tentatively planned for Feb. 19th at St. Edward's, more details as it approaches. Haitian ESL is another Knights supported effort to teach the Haitians English (ESL)and has also had its first class on Friday Jan. 26th. Nine women and men along with three children attended the class staffed by a group of retired ESL teachers and local volunteers. The class was held from 9:30 to 12, snacks were also provided and donated clothing was distributed. It's hoped that more students will attend as the program gains traction.
