

On going food pantry news:

The local food pantry would like to ask for donations of small size (not family-sized) boxes of cereals, oatmeal, not sugar filled etc., small jars of peanut butter and jelly or jam, for our elderly in need. Smaller sizes work best for these individuals. Our students are still working with and delivering to the pantry on a regular basis.

Online giving is easier than you think. All you need is a computer or phone and a credit card or even direct bank transfer. You can do a one-time payment or set up weekly or monthly payments. If you are not sure, try a one-time payment to check it out. Our site is fully secured and private.

- 1) Go to: www.stdenisashburnham.com
- 2) Choose "Online Giving" from the top bar.
- 3) Click "Offertory"
- 4) "Chose A Fund" (i.e. Sunday Mass Offertory)
- 5) "Sub Funds" may also be available.
- 6) Add amount and check the checkbox to make it a recurring payment.
- 7) Follow the prompts to edit payment data
- 8) Click "Submit"

Online giving will instruct you on how to enter payment and set up an account if you choose to. By setting up an account, you can change your giving at any time, check how much you have given, provide a steady income for your church even when you are away on vacation or worse a pandemic strikes that disrupt all business. No bounced check fees, and if you give a small amount every week you do not even notice it. A credit card can also be used which provides protection from fraud.

Migrant Refugee – Update

As many of you may already know, the Knights have been consistently working to support and welcome the migrant families living in our local shelters. The recent weeks haven't produced much good news as the State's looming shut down of the family shelter system is beginning to occur. Several families are now under eviction process and are still struggling to find permanent housing. If any of our parishioners know of any available apartments or other housing opportunities, please reach out to give us more information to share. On this note, the families that are fortunate to find housing are in need of many ordinary household items ranging from furniture, personal hygiene products and kitchen utensils such as pots, pans dishes, silverware and more. The list that follows are items that the Knights are hoping to collect through donations. If you have anything we will be setting up a plastic collection bin at the entrances of both parishes. Any larger items you may wish to donate can be picked up if you contact me. Thank you all for your continued care and support.

Cooking pots, pans, small kitchen appliances. non perishable food items for cooking, can openers, knives, potato peelers, cutting boards plates, cups, eating utensils, paper towels, napkins, cleaning supplies ie:(brooms, mops and mop buckets) cleaning sprays, dishes, sponges, dish soap, dish drying racks, twin, full and queen size bed sheets and comforters curtains (kitchen, bathroom, living room, and bedrooms) lamps, side tables, living room pieces We can also store a small amount of small furniture at a time at the shelter.
